A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 1 of Article 7 of Chapter 14 of Title 44 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to general provisions of foreclosure, so as to provide that an appraisal
- 3 must be performed for a deficiency judgment on real estate sold on foreclosure; to provide
- 4 for deficiency judgment amount determinations; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Part 1 of Article 7 of Chapter 14 of Title 44 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 9 relating to general provisions of foreclosure, is amended by revising Code Section
- 10 44-14-161, relating to deficiency judgments for real estate sold on foreclosure, to read as
- 11 follows:

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- 12 "44-14-161.
- 13 (a) When any real estate is sold on foreclosure, without legal process, and under powers
- 14 contained in security deeds, mortgages, or other lien contracts and at the sale the real estate
- does not bring the amount of the debt secured by the deed, mortgage, or contract, no action
- may be taken to obtain a deficiency judgment unless the person instituting the foreclosure
- proceedings produces evidence of an appraisal of the property conducted within 30 days
- prior to the foreclosure proceedings. For purposes of this Code section, property appraisals
- shall be performed by an independent licensed appraiser who is not an employee of the
- 20 <u>person instituting the foreclosure proceedings.</u> shall, within Within 30 days after the sale,
- 21 <u>a report of the sale and appraisal documents shall be reported</u> to the judge of the superior
- court of the county in which the land is located for to obtain confirmation and approval and
- 23 shall obtain an order of confirmation and approval thereon.
- 24 (b) The court shall require evidence to show the true market appraised value of the
- property sold under the powers and shall not confirm the sale unless it is satisfied that the
- 26 property so sold brought its true market value on such foreclosure sale. A deficiency

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judgment shall be the lesser of the debt amount minus the appraisal amount or the debt
 amount minus the highest accepted bid at the foreclosure sale.

- 29 (c) The court shall direct that a notice of the hearing shall be given to the debtor at least
- five days prior thereto; and at the hearing, the court shall also pass upon the legality of the
- 31 notice, advertisement, and regularity of the sale. The court may order a resale of the

32 property for good cause shown."

33 SECTION 2.

34 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
