The House Committee on Judiciary offers the following substitute to SB 130:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 11 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 2 Juvenile Code, so as to make revisions to the Juvenile Code; to provide that adoption
- 3 proceedings be stayed while an appeal of an order to terminate parental rights is pending; to
- 4 clarify the court's duties to a case while an appeal is pending; to clarify provisions relating
- 5 to the waiver of the right to counsel; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws;
- 6 and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 11 of Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Juvenile
- 10 Code, is amended by revising Code Section 15-11-35, relating to appeals, as follows:
- 11 "15-11-35.
- 12 In all cases of final judgments of the juvenile court, appeals shall be taken to the Court of
- 13 Appeals or the Supreme Court in the same manner as appeals from the superior court.
- 14 However, no such judgment or order shall be superseded or modified except in the
- discretion of the trial court; rather, the judgment or order of the court shall stand until
- reversed or modified by the reviewing court. The appeal of an order granting a petition to
- 17 <u>terminate parental rights shall stay an adoption proceeding related to the child who is the</u>
- 18 <u>subject of such order until such order becomes final by the conclusion of appellate</u>
- 19 proceedings or the expiration of the time for seeking such review. Except for proceedings
- in connection with an adoption, the court shall continue to conduct hearings and issue
- 21 orders in accordance with this chapter while an appeal in a case is pending."
- SECTION 2.
- 23 Said chapter is further amended by revising subsection (g) of Code Section 15-11-103,
- 24 relating to the right to an attorney, as follows:

"(g) A party other than a child shall be informed of his or her right to an attorney prior to
 any hearing. A party other than a child shall be given an opportunity to:

- 27 (1) Obtain and employ an attorney of such party's own choice;
- 28 (2) Obtain a court appointed attorney if the court determines that such party is an
- indigent person; or
- 30 (3) Waive the right to an attorney, provided that such waiver is made knowingly,
- 31 <u>voluntarily, and on the record."</u>

32 SECTION 3.

- 33 Said chapter is further amended by revising subsection (b) of Code Section 15-11-511,
- relating to arraignment, admissions at arraignment, and right to attorney, as follows:
- 35 "(b) The court may accept an admission at arraignment and may proceed immediately to
- disposition if a child is represented by counsel at arraignment. If a child's liberty is not in
- jeopardy, he or she may waive the right to counsel at arraignment, provided that such
- 38 waiver is made knowingly, voluntarily, and on the record. A child represented by counsel
- or whose liberty is not in jeopardy may make a preliminary statement indicating whether
- 40 he or she plans to admit or deny the allegations of the complaint at the adjudication
- 41 hearing. The court shall not accept an admission from a child whose liberty is in jeopardy
- and who is unrepresented by counsel."

44 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
