| 12 | (a) As used in this Code section, the term:   |
| 13 | (1) 'High needs school' means a public school which has received a school climate rating    |
| 14 | of '1-star' or '2-star' pursuant to Code Section 20-14-33.                                  |
| 15 | (2) 'Positive behavioral interventions and supports' or 'PBIS' means an evidence based      |
| 16 | data-driven framework to reduce disciplinary incidents, increase a school's sense of        |
| 17 | safety, and support improved academic outcomes through a multitiered approach, using        |
| 18 | disciplinary data and principles of behavior analysis to develop school-wide, targeted,     |
| 19 | and individualized interventions and supports.  |
| 20 | (3) 'Response to intervention' or 'RTI' means a framework of identifying and addressing     |
| 21 | the academic and behavioral needs of students through a tiered system.                      |
| 22 | (b) Local boards of education are encouraged to implement PBIS and RTI programs and         |
| 23 | initiatives in their schools, and particularly in high needs schools.                       |
| 24 | (c) The State Board of Education is authorized, subject to appropriations by the General    |
| 25 | Assembly, to provide funds to local school systems to support PBIS and RTI programs,        |
| 26 | initiatives, and personnel.   |
| 27 | (d) The State Board of Education is authorized to establish rules and regulations for PBIS  |
| 28 | and RTI programs and initiatives which receive funding pursuant to this Code section."      |
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
