A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 2 of Title 28 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 apportionment of the House of Representatives and the Senate and qualifications of
- 3 members, so as to create the Citizens' Redistricting Commission; to provide for its
- 4 membership and its duties; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and
- 5 for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Chapter 2 of Title 28 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to apportionment
- 9 of the House of Representatives and the Senate and qualifications of members, is amended
- 10 by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 11 "28-2-3.
- 12 (a) There is created the Citizens' Redistricting Commission which shall be established as
- provided in this Code section.
- 14 (b) The commission shall consist of seven members appointed as follows:
- 15 (1) One member appointed by the Lieutenant Governor;
- 16 (2) One member appointed by the minority leader of the Senate;
- 17 (3) One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 18 (4) One member appointed by the minority leader of the House of Representatives;
- 19 (5) Two members appointed by the Governor, only one of whom may be a member of
- 20 <u>the same political party as the Governor; and</u>
- 21 (6) One member who shall be selected and appointed by the other six members of the
- 22 <u>commission.</u>
- 23 <u>In the year following a United States decennial census, the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, </u>
- 24 Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the minority leaders of the Senate and the
- 25 <u>House of Representatives shall make their respective appointments not later than March</u>
- 26 <u>1 of such year, and the member to be selected by such appointees shall be selected not later</u>

27 than March 15 of such year. In the case of a court order directing that congressional or

- 28 <u>legislative redistricting be done, the appointments by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor,</u>
- 29 Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the minority leaders of the Senate and the
- 30 House of Representatives shall be made not later than 30 days following such order, and
- 31 the member to be selected by such appointees shall be selected not later than 45 days
- 32 <u>following such order. In the event that the six members of the commission cannot agree</u>
- 33 upon a seventh member within such time periods, the seventh member shall be selected by
- 34 <u>the Georgia Supreme Court not later than 15 days following the expiration of such time</u>
- 35 periods. The seventh member shall be the chairperson of the commission.
- 36 (c) A person shall be eligible for appointment to serve on the commission if such person:
- 37 (1) As of the date of his or her appointment, is registered to vote for federal and state
- 38 <u>offices in Georgia and was registered to vote in the two most recent state November</u>
- 39 general elections held in Georgia;
- 40 (2) Is not a current member of the General Assembly and does not hold any federal or
- 41 state elective office while serving on the commission; and
- 42 (3) Certifies and agrees at the time of such person's appointment that such person will
- not run as a candidate for any federal or state elective office while serving on the
- 44 <u>commission and for a period of two years thereafter.</u>
- 45 (d) Vacancies on the commission shall be filled in the same manner in which the original
- 46 <u>appointment was made.</u>
- 47 (e) Members of the commission shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the
- 48 performance of their duties on the commission in the same manner as members of the
- 49 General Assembly. The General Assembly is authorized to provide for the payment of
- 50 reasonable compensation to the members of the commission. The General Assembly shall
- 51 provide adequate funding to the commission, including the employment of a competent
- 52 <u>staff, in order for the commission to carry out its duties. The General Assembly shall</u>
- 53 provide adequate funding for the representation of the commission in any litigation; and
- 54 <u>the Department of Law shall have the responsibility for such representation.</u>
- 55 (f) The commission shall have the following duties:
- 56 (1) To create proposed congressional and House of Representatives and Senate
- 57 <u>legislative districts for submission to the General Assembly for approval or rejection;</u>
- 58 (2) Prior to developing a proposed plan or making any recommendations, to conduct
- 59 <u>public hearings throughout all areas of this state, including at least one hearing in each</u>
- 60 congressional district in this state, after adequate advance notice to the public so that all
- 61 <u>interested citizens have a reasonable opportunity to express their views with regard to</u>
- 62 <u>redistricting plans; and</u>

63 (3) To conduct meetings, discussions, and deliberations in public and provide ample

- 64 <u>notice of the meetings of the commission to facilitate public participation and attendance.</u>
- 65 (g) In developing proposed redistricting plans for submission to the General Assembly for
- approval or rejection, the commission shall adhere to the following criteria:
- 67 (1) The plan shall be in compliance with the Constitutions of this state and the United
- 68 States;
- 69 (2) The plan shall be in compliance with the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as
- 70 <u>amended</u>;
- 71 (3) The plan shall contain only contiguous districts;
- 72 (4) The plan shall contain districts that are as compact as possible or practicable;
- 73 (5) The plan shall maintain communities of interest, as determined by the commission
- from time to time to the extent that it is reasonably possible to do so; and
- 75 (6) The plan, if for congressional redistricting, shall provide for zero deviation among
- 76 the districts and, if for legislative redistricting, shall provide for as close as practicable
- 77 <u>to zero deviation among the districts.</u>
- 78 (h) The commission shall, no later than July 1 of the year following the year in which a
- 79 <u>United States decennial census is conducted and as soon as practicable following a court</u>
- 80 ordered redistricting, submit its report with a proposed congressional redistricting plan, a
- 81 proposed redistricting plan for the House of Representatives, and a proposed redistricting
- 82 plan for the Senate to the General Assembly for approval. Such plans shall be voted upon
- 83 <u>by both houses of the General Assembly without amendment. If either house of the</u>
- 84 General Assembly declines to approve a plan, the plan and the report shall be returned to
- 85 the commission with such specific suggestions as the Senate or the House of
- 86 Representatives, as applicable, believes would eliminate the basis for disapproval of the
- 87 plan. The commission shall then meet and revise the plan and submit a new report and
- proposed plan to the General Assembly within 15 days following the disapproval of the
- 89 plan. Such revised plan shall be voted upon by the General Assembly without amendment.
- 90 <u>If either house of the General Assembly declines to approve the revised plan, the General</u>
- 91 <u>Assembly shall proceed to formulate and enact a redistricting plan on its own.</u>
- 92 (i) Upon the approval or final rejection of each of the proposed plans by the General
- 93 Assembly, the commission shall be dissolved."

94 SECTION 2.

- 95 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 96 without such approval.

97 **SECTION 3.**

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
