## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 elementary and secondary education, so as to enact the "Parent Charter School Trigger Act";
- 3 to provide for petitions to convert charter schools to traditional public schools; to provide for
- 4 definitions; to allow for petitions by parents; to provide for notice to the State Board of
- 5 Education; to provide for local board approval; to provide for rules and regulations; to
- 6 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

9 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Parent Charter School Trigger Act."

SECTION 2.

- 11 Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to elementary and
- secondary education, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:
- 13 "ARTICLE 35
- 14 <u>20-2-2200.</u>
- 15 As used in this article, the term:
- (1) 'Petition' means a petition submitted pursuant to this article.
- 17 (2) 'Petitioning group' means parents or legal guardians submitting a petition pursuant
- to subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-2201.

- 19 <u>20-2-2201.</u>
- 20 (a) A petition may be submitted to convert any charter school to a traditional public school
- 21 <u>in accordance with the provisions of this article, beginning with school year 2014-2015.</u>
- 22 (b) A petition may be submitted by a majority of the parents or legal guardians of students
- 23 who are eligible to enroll in the school the following year, or for a high school cluster, a
- 24 <u>majority of the parents or guardians of students who are eligible to enroll in one of the</u>
- 25 <u>schools within the high school cluster the following year, as evidenced by the signatures</u>
- of more than 50 percent of such parents or guardians. For purposes of this subsection, only
- 27 one parent or guardian per student and such student's siblings shall be entitled to indicate
- 28 their approval by signature and parents or guardians signing the petition shall also indicate
- 29 <u>the student or students in their household.</u>
- 30 (c) Signatures for petitions under this Code section shall be collected on a standard form
- or forms established by the state board.
- 32 (d) Parents and legal guardians shall be free from harassment, threats, or intimidation
- 33 related to circulation or signature of a petition, discouraging such persons from signing a
- 34 <u>petition or revoking a signature.</u>

- A petition may be submitted to a local board of education by a petitioning group pursuant
- 37 <u>to subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-2201 to convert a charter school to a traditional</u>
- 38 <u>public school.</u>
- 39 <u>20-2-2203.</u>
- 40 (a) The local board shall notify the state board upon receipt of a petition and upon its final
- 41 <u>disposition of such petition.</u>
- 42 (b) Upon receipt of a petition, a local board shall have no more than 30 days to review and
- 43 <u>verify the signatures on such petition</u>. In the event that the local board does not complete
- 44 <u>such verification within 30 days, such petition shall be deemed verified for purposes of this</u>
- 45 article.
- 46 (c) Upon verification of signatures on a petition submitted pursuant to Code Section
- 47 <u>20-2-2202</u>, the local board shall give written notice within ten days to the petitioning group
- 48 of such verification and shall review the charter in question to determine whether it may
- 49 <u>be terminated.</u>

- 51 (a) Any school that is converted to a traditional public school pursuant to this article shall
- 52 <u>continue to serve the attendance boundary and to serve all the students who attended the</u>
- 53 <u>school in the school year prior to the conversion</u>.
- 54 (b) Any parent or legal guardian who does not want their child to attend a school that has
- 55 <u>been converted to a traditional public school pursuant to this article shall have the right to</u>
- 56 <u>enroll their child in another local school within the school system.</u>
- 57 <u>20-2-2205.</u>
- 58 The state board shall promulgate rules and regulations with respect to timelines, petitions,
- and other applicable procedures to facilitate the implementation of this article."

## SECTION 3.

61 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
