A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 1 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 general provisions relative to professions and businesses, so as to change the expiration and
- 3 renewal dates for certain licenses and certificates issued by certain professional licensing
- 4 boards; to prohibit professional licensing boards from requiring continuing education and
- 5 training once a license has been issued except in the event disciplinary action has been taken
- 6 against the licensee; to provide for exceptions and for applicability; to provide for the
- 7 division director of the Secretary of State to adopt rules and regulations to effectuate such
- 8 provisions; to provide for related matters; to provide effective dates; to repeal conflicting
- 9 laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

11 SECTION 1.

- 12 Chapter 1 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
- 13 provisions relative to professions and businesses, is amended by revising Code
- 14 Section 43-1-4, relating to expiration, renewal, and penalty dates of licenses and certificates
- 15 and duration of validity, as follows:
- 16 "43-1-4.

- 17 (a) The division director shall determine the expiration, renewal, and penalty dates for
- each license and certificate issued by the professional licensing boards through the office
- of the division director which is subject to renewal. Before becoming effective, these
- 20 expiration, renewal, and penalty dates must shall be approved by the respective
- 21 professional licensing boards.
- 22 (b) Each On and before December 31, 2013, each license and certificate issued by the
- professional licensing boards through the office of the division director which are is subject
- 24 to renewal shall be valid for up to two <u>six</u> years and shall be renewable biennially on the
- 25 renewal date established by the division director, as approved by the respective
- professional licensing boards. On and after January 1, 2014, each license and certificate
- 27 <u>issued by the professional licensing boards through the office of the division director which</u>

28 <u>is subject to renewal shall be valid for six years and shall be renewable on the renewal date</u>

- 29 <u>established by the division director, as approved by the respective professional licensing</u>
- 30 boards.
- 31 (c) The division director is authorized to adopt the necessary rules and regulations to
- implement the biennial renewal of licenses and certificates in such manner as to ensure that
- the number of renewals is reasonably evenly distributed throughout each two-year six-year
- 34 period.
- 35 (d) The provisions of this Code section shall not be applicable to the renewal of licenses
- 36 and certificates under the professional licensing boards established under Chapter 4 of
- 37 <u>Title 26 and Chapters 9, 10A, 11, 11A, 26 through 30, 33, 34, 35, 39, 44, and 50 of this</u>
- 38 <u>title. Instead, each license and certificate issued by such professional licensing boards</u>
- 39 through the office of the division director which is subject to renewal shall be valid for up
- 40 to two years and shall be renewable biennially on the renewal date established by the
- 41 <u>division director, as approved by the respective professional licensing boards."</u>

42 SECTION 2.

- 43 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 44 "<u>43-1-4.1.</u>
- 45 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this Code section and notwithstanding any other
- 46 provisions of law to the contrary, once a licensee has been issued a license by a
- 47 <u>professional licensing board, such licensee shall not be required to obtain any additional</u>
- 48 <u>continuing education or training in order to maintain such license unless disciplinary action</u>
- 49 <u>has been taken against such licensee</u>, and all appeals contesting any such disciplinary
- 50 action afforded to the licensee have been exhausted. The division director, with the
- approval of the respective professional licensing boards, shall determine what type of
- 52 <u>disciplinary action shall warrant mandatory continuing education or training, the nature and</u>
- 53 <u>extent of such continuing education or training, and the time in which it must be completed.</u>
- 54 (b) The division director and each of the respective professional licensing boards are
- 55 <u>authorized to adopt the necessary rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this</u>
- 56 <u>Code section.</u>
- 57 (c) This Code section shall not apply to any continuing education or training required by
- 58 professional licensing boards established under Chapter 4 of Title 26 and Chapters 9, 10A,
- 59 <u>11, 11A, 26 through 30, 33, 34, 35, 39, 44, and 50 of this title."</u>

SECTION 3.

- 61 For purposes of proposing rules and regulations, this Act shall become effective upon its
- 62 approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval. For all other
- 63 purposes, this Act shall become effective on July 1, 2013.

SECTION 4.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
