# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Part 3 of Article 1 of Chapter 2 of Title 38 of the Official Code of Georgia
Annotated, relating to the State Defense Force, so as to remove the restrictions regarding the
right of public officers and employees to be absent for service on the State Defense Force and
regarding reemployment rights of persons after service on the State Defense Force; to
provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

#### **SECTION 1.**

8 Part 3 of Article 1 of Chapter 2 of Title 38 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
9 relating to the State Defense Force, is amended by revising Code Section 38-2-54, relating

- 10 to duties, privileges, and immunities of members of the State Defense Force, as follows:
- 11 *"*38-2-54.

12 All duties imposed by the military law or other statutes of the state or by regulations issued 13 thereunder upon units, commissioned officers, warrant officers, and enlisted personnel of 14 the organized militia are imposed upon the units, commissioned officers, warrant officers, 15 and enlisted personnel, respectively, of the State Defense Force. All rights, privileges, and immunities conferred by the military law or other statutes of the state or by regulations 16 17 issued thereunder upon the units, commissioned officers, warrant officers, and enlisted personnel of the Georgia National Guard or of the organized militia are conferred upon the 18 19 units, commissioned officers, warrant officers, and enlisted personnel, respectively, of the 20 State Defense Force except as otherwise prescribed in this chapter; provided, however, that 21 the provisions of Code Sections 38-2-279 and 38-2-280 shall not be applicable to personnel 22 of the State Defense Force. Such rights, privileges, and immunities include relief from civil or criminal liability for acts done while on duty; rights to pay, allowances, and other 23 24 compensation; expenses and subsistence; arms, uniforms, and equipment; provision, maintenance, use, and control of armories; eligibility to appointment on the military staff 25 of the Governor; exemption from civil process and from jury duty; right of way; right to 26

- 27 wear the uniform and to parade with firearms; and all other rights, privileges, and
- 28 immunities created by statute or custom not hereinbefore specifically enumerated."

## 29 SECTION 2.

30 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
