AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 43-34-25 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 delegation of certain medical acts to advanced practice registered nurses, so as to provide an
- 3 exception to the number of advanced practice registered nurses with which a delegating
- 4 physician can enter into a protocol agreement at any one time for nurses in certain locations
- 5 under certain conditions; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
- 6 other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 9 Code Section 43-34-25 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to delegation of
- 10 certain medical acts to advanced practice registered nurses, is amended by revising
- subsection (g) and by adding a new subsection to read as follows:
- 12 "(g) A Except as otherwise provided in subsection (g.1) of this Code section, a delegating
- physician may not enter into a nurse protocol agreement pursuant to this Code section with
- more than four advanced practice registered nurses at any one time, except this limitation
- shall not apply to an advanced practice registered nurse that who is practicing:
- 16 (1) In a hospital licensed under Title 31;
- 17 (2) In any college or university as defined in Code Section 20-8-1;
- 18 (3) In the Department of Public Health;
- 19 (4) In any county board of health;
- 20 (4.1) In any community service board;
- 21 (5) In any free health clinic;
- 22 (6) In a birthing center;
- 23 (7) In any entity:
- 24 (A) Which is exempt from federal taxes pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal
- Revenue Code, as defined in Code Section 48-1-2, and primarily serves uninsured or
- indigent Medicaid and medicare patients; or

27 (B) Which has been established under the authority of or is receiving funds pursuant 28 to 42 U.S.C. Section 254b or 254c of the United States Public Health Service Act;

- 29 (8) In any local board of education which has a school nurse program; or
- 30 (9) In a health maintenance organization that has an exclusive contract with a medical
- 31 group practice and arranges for the provision of substantially all physician services to
- enrollees in health benefits of the health maintenance organization; or
- 33 (10) In any emergency medical services system operated by, or on behalf of, any county
- or municipality with a full-time medical director."
- 35 (g.1) A delegating physician may not enter into a nurse protocol agreement pursuant to this
- 36 Code section with more than ten advanced practice registered nurses at any one time, may
- 37 <u>not supervise more than four advanced practice registered nurses at any one time pursuant</u>
- 38 to nurse protocol agreements, and shall not be required to conduct any meetings,
- 39 <u>observations</u>, or review of medical records except as otherwise provided in this subsection,
- 40 <u>if the advanced practice registered nurses practice at a location that:</u>
- 41 (1) Maintains evidence-based clinical practice guidelines;
- 42 (2) Is accredited by an accrediting body, approved by the board, such as the Joint
- 43 <u>Commission or a nationally recognized accrediting organization with comparable</u>
- 44 <u>standards</u>;
- 45 (3) Requires the delegating physician to document and maintain a record of review of
- 46 <u>at least 10 percent of the advanced practice registered nurses' medical records to monitor</u>
- 47 quality of care being provided to patients, which may be conducted electronically or
- 48 <u>onsite</u>;
- 49 (4) Requires the delegating physician and advanced practice registered nurse to
- 50 participate in and maintain documentation of quarterly clinical collaboration meetings,
- 51 either by telephone, in person, or onsite, for purposes of monitoring care being provided
- 52 <u>to patients; and</u>
- 53 (5) Requires the delegating physician's name, contact information, and record of the visit
- 54 <u>to be provided to the patient's primary care provider of choice with the patient's consent</u>
- 55 within 24 hours of the visit."

57 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
