A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 elections and primaries generally, so as to authorize local governments to conduct elections
- 3 by paper ballot in 2021; to provide for related matters; to provide an effective date; to repeal
- 4 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to elections and
- 8 primaries generally, is amended by revising Code Section 21-2-282, which is reserved, to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 "21-2-282.
- In any primary or election conducted during 2021, the primary or election may be
- 12 conducted by a county, municipality, or consolidated government, at the option of its
- 13 election superintendent, by paper ballot in the manner provided for in Code
- 14 Section 21-2-334. Reserved."

15 SECTION 2.

- 16 Said chapter is further amended by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of Code
- 17 Section 21-2-300, relating to provision of new voting equipment by state, uniform system
- 18 for all elections to be conducted with use of scanning ballots marked by electronic ballot
- 19 markers, pilot programs authorized, county responsibilities, education, and county and
- 20 municipal contracts for equipment, as follows:
- 21 "(a)(1) The Except as otherwise provided for in Code Section 21-2-282, the equipment
- used for casting and counting votes in county, state, and federal elections shall be the
- same in each county in this state and shall be provided to each county by the state, as
- determined by the Secretary of State."
- 25 SECTION 3.
- 26 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 27 without such approval.
- 28 SECTION 4.
- 29 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
