A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 13 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 controlled substances, so as to provide that possession of certain quantities of marijuana
- 3 constitute a misdemeanor; to change provisions relating to punishment; to amend Title 15,
- 4 Title 16, Chapter 7 of Title 17, and Code Section 36-32-6 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 5 Annotated, relating to courts, crimes and offenses, pretrial proceedings, and municipal court
- 6 jurisdiction in marijuana possession cases, respectively, so as to provide for conforming
- 7 cross-references; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 8 purposes.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

10 PART I

11 **SECTION 1-1.**

- 12 Chapter 13 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to controlled
- 13 substances, is amended by revising subsection (b) of Code Section 16-13-2, relating to
- 14 possession of marijuana and conditional discharge for possession of controlled substances
- 15 as first offense and certain nonviolent property crimes, as follows:

16 "(b) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any person who is charged with possession

- of marijuana, which possession is of one ounce or less, It shall be unlawful for any person
- 18 to possess or have under his or her control two ounces or less of marijuana. Any person
- 19 <u>who violates this subsection</u> shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and <u>upon conviction thereof</u>,
- 20 <u>shall be punished as follows:</u>
- 21 (1) If the aggregate weight is one-half ounce or less, he or she shall be punished by a fine
- 22 not to exceed \$300.00; and
- 23 (2) If the aggregate weight is at least one-half ounce but not more than two ounces, he
- or she shall be punished by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 12 months or a fine
- 25 not to exceed \$1,000.00, or both, or public works community service not to exceed 12
- 26 months."

27 **SECTION 1-2.**

- 28 Said chapter is further amended by revising subsection (j) of Code Section 16-13-30, relating
- 29 to purchase, possession, manufacture, distribution, or sale of controlled substances or
- 30 marijuana, as follows:
- (j)(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to possess, have under his or her control,
- manufacture, deliver, distribute, dispense, administer, purchase, sell, or possess with
- intent to distribute two ounces or more of marijuana or possess with the intent to
- 34 distribute marijuana.
- 35 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c) of Code Section 16-13-31 or in Code
- 36 Section 16-13-2, any person who violates this subsection shall be guilty of a felony and,
- upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one year nor
- more than ten years."

39 PART II 40 **SECTION 2-1.**

- 41 Title 15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to courts, is amended by revising
- 42 subsection (b) of Code Section 15-7-4, relating to state court jurisdiction, as follows:
- 43 "(b) Each state court shall have jurisdiction, within the territorial limits of the county or
- 44 counties for which it was created and concurrent with other courts having such jurisdiction,
- 45 over possession of one ounce or less of marijuana, in accordance with Code Sections
- 46 Section 16-13-2 and 16-13-30."
- 47 **SECTION 2-2.**
- 48 Said title is further amended by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of Code Section
- 49 15-9-30.6, relating to probate court jurisdiction over certain drug and alcohol offenses, as
- 50 follows:
- 51 "(1) Possession of one ounce or less of marijuana, in accordance with Code Sections
- 52 Section 16-13-2 and 16-13-30; and"
- 53 **SECTION 2-3.**
- 54 Said title is further amended by revising subsection (a) and paragraph (1) of subsection (c)
- 55 of Code Section 15-10-260, relating to magistrate court jurisdiction, as follows:
- 56 "(a) This article governs trials of misdemeanor violations of Code Sections 16-13-30,
- 57 16-13-2, 16-8-14, 16-8-14.1, 3-3-23, and 16-7-21."
- 58 "(1) For possession of less than one ounce of marijuana, as provided in subsection (b) of
- 59 Code Section 16-13-2;"

SECTION 2-4.

- 61 Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to crimes and offenses, is
- 62 amended by revising paragraph (4) of subsection (b) of Code Section 16-11-106, relating to
- 63 possession of a firearm or knife during the commission or attempt to commit certain crimes,
- 64 as follows:
- 65 "(4) Any crime involving the possession, manufacture, delivery, distribution, dispensing,
- administering, selling, or possession with intent to distribute any controlled substance or
- 67 marijuana as provided in Code Section Sections 16-13-2 and 16-13-30, any counterfeit
- substance as defined in Code Section 16-13-21, or any noncontrolled substance as
- 69 provided in Code Section 16-13-30.1; or"

70 **SECTION 2-5.**

- 71 Said title is further amended by revising subparagraph (a)(2)(B) of Code Section 16-13-5,
- 72 relating to immunity from arrest or prosecution for persons seeking medical assistance for
- 73 a drug overdose, as follows:
- 74 "(B) A violation of paragraph (1) of subsection (j) (b) of Code Section 16-13-30
- 75 <u>16-13-2</u> for possession of less than one ounce of marijuana; or"

76 **SECTION 2-6.**

- 77 Chapter 7 of Title 17 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to pretrial
- 78 proceedings, is amended by revising Code Section 17-7-72, relating to jurisdiction of probate
- 79 courts to try certain drug and alcohol offenses, as follows:
- 80 "17-7-72.
- 81 In probate courts which have jurisdiction over misdemeanor possession of marijuana in
- 82 accordance with Code Sections Section 16-13-2 and 16-13-30 and certain misdemeanor
- violations of Code Section 3-3-23 pursuant to Code Section 15-9-30.6, the following
- 84 offenses may be tried upon a summons or citation without an accusation:

85 (1) Possession of one ounce or less of marijuana, in accordance with Code Sections 86 Section 16-13-2 and 16-13-30; and

87 (2) Any violation of paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of Code Section 3-3-23 which is 88 punishable as a misdemeanor, but not violations punishable as high and aggravated

89 misdemeanors."

90 **SECTION 2-7.**

91 Code Section 36-32-6 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to municipal court

92 jurisdiction in marijuana possession cases, is amended by revising subsections (a) and (c) as

93 follows:

94 "(a) The municipal court of any municipality is granted jurisdiction to try and dispose of

cases where a person is charged with the <u>misdemeanor</u> possession of one ounce or less of

96 marijuana if the offense occurred within the corporate limits of such municipality. The

97 jurisdiction of any such court shall be concurrent with the jurisdiction of any other courts

within the county having jurisdiction to try and dispose of such cases."

99 "(c) Any defendant charged with possession of an ounce or less of marijuana in a

municipal court shall be entitled on request to have the case against him or her transferred

to the court having general misdemeanor jurisdiction in the county wherein the alleged
