A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 3 of Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to water well standards, so as to permanently extend the moratorium on
- 3 well or borehole construction for the injection of ground water into certain aquifers; to
- 4 permanently extend the moratorium on acceptance of bonds or letters of credit by the director
- 5 for certain aquifer injection operations; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Part 3 of Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 9 relating to water well standards, is amended by revising paragraph (7) of Code Section
- 10 12-5-134, relating to standards and wells for boreholes, as follows:
- 11 "(7) No well or borehole shall be drilled or used <u>and no existing well or borehole shall</u>
- be converted for the purpose of injecting any surface or ground water into the Floridan
- aquifer in any county governed by the Georgia coastal zone management program
- provided by Code Section 12-5-327 before July 1, 2014."

15 SECTION 2.

- 16 Said part is further amended in Code Section 12-5-135, relating to requirement of bond or
- 17 letter of credit for water well contractors and drillers, by revising subsection (i) as follows:
- 18 "(i) No bond or irrevocable letter of credit provided for in this Code section shall be
- accepted by the director from any water well contractor or driller who shall drill any <u>new</u>
- well or borehole <u>or convert any existing well or borehole</u> for the purpose of injecting any
- surface <u>or ground</u> water into the Floridan aquifer in any county governed by the Georgia
- coastal zone management program provided by Code Section 12-5-327 after July 1, 2003,
- 23 and before July 1, 2014."
- SECTION 3.
- 25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
