Cha	pter 8 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to county police,
is ar	mended by revising Code Section 36-8-6, which was previously reserved, as follows:
<b>"</b> 30	5-8-6.
<u>(a)</u>	After a county police department is created pursuant to this chapter, it may be
<u>ab</u>	olished by:
(	1) A local Act of the General Assembly; or
(	2) A resolution of the governing authority of the county.
<u>(b</u>	A local Act or resolution of the county governing authority to abolish a county police
<u>de</u>	partment pursuant to subsection (a) of this Code section shall be conditioned upon
<u>ap</u>	proval of such local Act or resolution of the county governing authority by the electors
<u>of</u>	the county voting in a referendum.
<u>(c)</u>	If such local Act or resolution of the county governing authority is approved by the
ele	ectors of the county, the county police department shall be abolished 180 days following
su	ch referendum. At such time, all property, equipment, records, documents, funds, and
<u>otl</u>	ner items in the possession or control of the county police department shall be transferred
to	the sheriff of the county.

(d) This Act shall be repealed by operation of law on January 1, 2022. Reserved."
