A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 49-4-168.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 civil penalties for false or fraudulent Medicaid claims, so as to modify the civil penalties that
- 3 shall be imposed in order to allow this state to recover the maximum penalty authorized by
- 4 federal law; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Code Section 49-4-168.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to civil
- 9 penalties for false or fraudulent Medicaid claims, is amended by revising subsection (a) as
- 10 follows:
- 11 "(a) Any person who:
- 12 (1) Knowingly presents or causes to be presented to the Georgia Medicaid program a
- false or fraudulent claim for payment or approval;
- 14 (2) Knowingly makes, uses, or causes to be made or used a false record or statement
- material to a false or fraudulent claim;
- 16 (3) Conspires to commit a violation of paragraph (1), (2), (4), (5), (6), or (7) of this
- subsection;
- 18 (4) Has possession, custody, or control of property or money used or to be used by the
- 19 Georgia Medicaid program and knowingly delivers, or causes to be delivered, less than
- all of such property or money;
- 21 (5) Is authorized to make or deliver a document certifying receipt of property used, or
- 22 to be used, by the Georgia Medicaid program and, intending to defraud the Georgia
- 23 Medicaid program, makes or delivers the receipt without completely knowing that the
- information on the receipt is true;

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25 (6) Knowingly buys, or receives as a pledge of an obligation or debt, public property from an officer or employee of the Georgia Medicaid program who lawfully may not sell 26 27 or pledge the property; or (7) Knowingly makes, uses, or causes to be made or used a false record or statement 28 29 material to an obligation to pay or transmit property or money to the Georgia Medicaid program, or knowingly conceals or knowingly and improperly avoids or decreases an 30 obligation to pay or transmit property or money to the Georgia Medicaid program, 31 32 shall be liable to the State of Georgia for a civil penalty of not less than \$5,500.00 and not 33 more than \$11,000.00 for each false or fraudulent claim consistent with the civil penalties 34 provision of the federal False Claims Act, 31 U.S.C. 3729(a), as adjusted by the federal Civil Penalties Inflation Adjustment Act of 1990 (28 U.S.C. 2461; Public Law 101-410), 35 36 and as further amended by the federal Civil Penalties Inflation Adjustment Improvements Act of 2015 (Sec. 701 of Public Law 114-74), plus three times the amount of damages 37 38 which the Georgia Medicaid program sustains because of the act of such person."

SECTION 2.

- 40 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 41 without such approval.

42 SECTION 3.

43 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
