A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 7 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 2 control of soil erosion and sedimentation, so as to shorten the time period for permit issuance
- 3 or denial by local issuing authorities; to clarify qualification standards for erosion and
- 4 sediment control plan designers and reviewers; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Chapter 7 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the control of
- 9 soil erosion and sedimentation, is amended in Code Section 12-7-9, relating to applications
- 10 for permits, by revising subsection (c) as follows:
- 11 "(c) Permits shall be issued or denied as soon as practicable after the application therefor
- has been filed with the local issuing authority, but in any event not later than $\frac{45}{14}$ days
- 13 thereafter."

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14 SECTION 2.

- 15 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 12-7-19, relating to education and
- 16 training programs, requirements, and qualifications, as follows:
- 17 "12-7-19.
- 18 (a)(1) Persons involved in land development design, review, permitting, construction,
- monitoring, or inspection or any land-disturbing activity shall meet the education and
- training certification requirements, dependent on his or her level of involvement with the
- process, as developed by the commission in accordance with this Code section and in
- consultation with the division and the Stakeholder Advisory Board created pursuant to
- 23 Code Section 12-7-20.
- 24 (2) On or after May 14, 2007, for each site on which land-disturbing activity occurs, each
- entity or person acting as either a primary, secondary, or tertiary permittee, as defined in
- 26 the state general permit, shall have as a minimum one person who is in responsible charge

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of erosion and sedimentation control activities on behalf of said entity or person and

- 28 meets the applicable education or training certification requirements developed by the
- commission present on site whenever land-disturbing activities are conducted on that site.
- A project site shall herein be defined as any land disturbance site or multiple sites within
- a larger common plan of development or sale permitted by an owner or operator for
- 32 compliance with the state general permit.
- 33 (3) Persons or entities involved in projects not requiring a state general permit but
- otherwise requiring certified personnel on site may contract with certified persons to meet
- 35 the requirements of this chapter.
- 36 (4) If a state general permittee who has operational control of land-disturbing activities
- for a site has met the certification requirements of paragraph (1) of subsection (b) of this
- Code section, then any person or entity involved in land-disturbing activity at that site
- and operating in a subcontractor capacity for such permittee shall have until December
- 40 31, 2007, to meet those educational requirements specified in paragraph (4) of subsection
- 41 (b) of Code Section 12-7-19 and shall not be required to meet any educational
- requirements that exceed those specified in said paragraph.
- 43 (b) No less than the following training programs shall be established:
- 44 (1) A fundamentals seminar (Level 1) will be established which provides sufficient
- 45 training to all participants as to the applicable laws, requirements, processes, and latest
- 46 means and methods recognized by this state to effectively control erosion and
- 47 sedimentation;
- 48 (2) An advanced fundamentals seminar (Level 1) will be established which provides
- 49 additional details of installation and maintenance of best management practices for both
- regulatory and nonregulatory inspectors and others;
- 51 (3) An introduction to design seminar (Level 2) will be established which provides
- required training to design and review a successful erosion, sedimentation, and pollution
- control plan;
- 54 (4) An awareness seminar (Level 1) will be established which does not exceed two hours
- in duration and which provides information regarding the erosion and sediment control
- practices and processes in the state and which will include an overview of the systems,
- laws, and roles of the participants; and
- 58 (5) A trainer and instructor seminar will be established for both Level 1 and Level 2
- trainers and instructors which will provide the minimum training as to applicable laws
- and best management practices and design of erosion, sedimentation, and pollution
- 61 control plans in this state.
- 62 (c) Trainer and instructor qualifications will Qualifications shall be established with the
- 63 following minimum requirements:

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64 (1) Level 1 trainers and instructors shall meet at least the following minimum 65 requirements and any other requirements as set by the commission:

- (A) Education: four-year college degree or five years' experience in the field of erosion and sediment control;
- (B) Experience: five-years' experience in the field of erosion and sediment control.
- Where years of experience is used in lieu of the education requirement of subparagraph
- 70 (A) of this paragraph, a total of ten years' field experience is required;
- 71 (C) Approval by the commission and the Stakeholder Advisory Board; and
- 72 (D) Successful completion of the Level 1 trainer and instructor seminar found in
- paragraph (5) of subsection (b) of this Code section; and
- 74 (2) Level 2 trainers and instructors shall meet at least the minimum requirements of a
- Level 1 trainer or instructor, any other requirements as set by the commission, and
- successful completion of the Level 2 trainer and instructor seminar created under
- paragraph (5) of subsection (b) of this Code section: and
- 78 (3) Level 2 designers and reviewers shall be professionally licensed in this state in a field
- 79 <u>related to soil and erosion control.</u>
- 80 (d) In addition to the requirements of subsection (c) of this Code section, the commission
- shall establish and any person desirous of holding certification must obtain a passing grade
- as established by the Stakeholder Advisory Board on a final exam covering the material
- taught in each mandatory seminar; provided, however, that there shall be no final exam
- requirement for purposes of paragraph (4) of subsection (b) of this Code section. Final
- exams may, at the discretion of the commission, serve in lieu of attendance at the seminar.
- Any person shall be authorized to administer a final examination for any seminar for which
- he or she was the instructor.
- 88 (e)(1) A certification provided by achieving the requirements established by the
- commission shall expire no later than three years after its issuance.
- 90 (2) A certified individual shall be required to attend and participate in at least four hours
- of approved continuing education courses, as established by the commission, every three
- 92 years.

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- 93 (3) A certification may be extended or renewed by meeting requirements established by
- 94 the commission.
- 95 (4) Revocation procedures may be established by the commission in consultation with
- 96 the division and the Stakeholder Advisory Board."

98 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
