A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 15-18-32 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 Prosecuting Attorneys Qualifications Commission, authority, membership, ex parte
- 3 communications, governance, disciplinary actions, confidentiality, and privileged nature; so
- 4 as to remove the provision for review and adoption by the Supreme Court; to provide for an
- 5 effective date; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 6 purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Code Section 15-18-32 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to Prosecuting
- 10 Attorneys Qualifications Commission, authority, membership, ex parte communications,
- 11 governance, disciplinary actions, confidentiality, and privileged nature, is amended by
- 12 revising subsection (g) as follows:
- 13 "(g) The commission, with the assistance of the Prosecuting Attorneys' Council of the State
- of Georgia, shall promulgate standards of conduct and rules for the commission's
- 15 governance which will comport with due process and enforce the provisions of subsections
- (h) and (i) of this Code section; provided, however, that such standards and rules shall be

effective only upon review and adoption by the Supreme Court. Such standards and rules shall allow for a full investigation of a district attorney or solicitor-general only upon majority vote of the investigative panel. When a commission member receives information relating to the conduct of a district attorney or solicitor-general, such member shall provide such information to the commission's director for appropriate action."

SECTION 2.

- 23 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming
- 24 law without such approval.

25 SECTION 3.

26 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
