A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 31-7-95 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
2 funding of medical education provided by hospital authorities and designated teaching  
3 hospitals, so as to revise definitions; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws;  
4 and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 **SECTION 1.**

7 Code Section 31-7-95 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to funding of  
8 medical education provided by hospital authorities and designated teaching hospitals, is  
9 amended by revising subsection (a) as follows:

10 "(a) As used in this Code section, the term:

11 (1) 'Designated teaching hospital' means a teaching hospital operated by other than a  
12 hospital authority, which hospital agrees to contract with the state to offer or continue to  
13 offer a residency program approved by the ~~American Medical Association~~ Accreditation  
14 Council for Graduate Medical Education, which program has at least 50 residents and  
15 which hospital operates a 24 hour, seven-day-per-week emergency room open to the  
16 public and which hospital files a semiannual statistical report consistent with those filed

17 by other state funded tertiary, neonatal, obstetrical centers with the Department of  
18 Community Health.

19 (2) 'Hospital authority' means a hospital authority operating a teaching hospital which  
20 offers a residency program approved by the ~~American Medical Association~~ Accreditation  
21 Council for Graduate Medical Education.

22 (3) 'Resident' means a physician receiving medical education and training through a  
23 teaching hospital operated by a hospital authority or designated teaching hospital."

24 **SECTION 2.**

25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
