A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 1 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
general provisions regarding state government, so as to prohibit state and local governments
from mandating COVID-19 vaccine passports; to provide for exceptions; to provide for
definitions; to provide for related matters; to provide for automatic repeal; to repeal
conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
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SECTION 1.

8 Chapter 1 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general9 provisions regarding state government, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as10 follows:

11 <u>"50-1-11.</u>

- 12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 13 (1) 'Agency' means:

14 (A) Every state department, agency, board, bureau, office, commission, public
15 corporation, and authority;

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16	(B) Every county, municipal corporation, school district, or other political subdivision
17	of this state;
18	(C) Every department, agency, board, bureau, office, commission, authority, or similar
19	body of each such county, municipal corporation, or other political subdivision of this
20	state; and
21	(D) Every city, county, regional, or other authority established pursuant to the laws of
22	this state.
23	(2) 'COVID-19' means severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2),
24	and any mutation or viral fragments thereof, or any disease or condition caused by severe
25	acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), which was the subject of the
26	public health state of emergency declared by the Governor on March 14, 2020.
27	(b)(1) No agency shall require proof of COVID-19 vaccination of any person as a
28	condition of providing any service or access to any facility, issuing any license, permit,
29	or other type of authorization, or performing any duty of such agency.
30	(2) No agency, through any rule, regulation, ordinance, resolution, or other action shall
31	require that any person or private entity require proof of COVID-19 vaccination of any
32	person as a condition of providing any service or access to any facility, or as a condition
33	of such person or private entity's performance of any regular activity by such person or
34	private entity.
35	(c) This Code section shall not apply if compliance with this Code section would require
36	an agency to violate one or more regulations of the federal Centers for Medicare and
37	Medicaid Services or any federal contractual terms applying to workplace locations in
38	which one or more individuals are working on or in connection with a federal government
39	<u>contract.</u>
40	(d) This Code section shall stand repealed by operation of law on June 30, 2023."

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SECTION 2.

42 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
