A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 46 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to generation and distribution of electricity generally, so as to provide for legislative
- 3 findings; to provide for the development, content, and review of grid security plans; to
- 4 provide for recovery of costs; to provide for coordination of efforts; to provide for related
- 5 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 9 (1) The maintenance of Georgia's electrical transmission grid system is critical to ensure
- the health and safety of the people of this state;
- 11 (2) It is recognized that such electrical transmission grid system within the State of
- Georgia is part of a regional system that is governed and administered by the SERC
- 13 Reliability Corporation;
- 14 (3) It is further recognized that such regional system is vulnerable to natural and nuclear
- 15 electromagnetic pulse and other manmade and natural acts that could disrupt service from
- such system for a period of time that could pose significant risk to the national security of
- 17 the region and the nation;
- 18 (4) It is thus incumbent upon the people of Georgia to take measures through its elected
- leadership to protect the portion of the electrical transmission grid system located within
- 20 this state to the greatest extent possible;
- 21 (5) It is further recognized that such protection cannot be implemented without the support
- and cooperation of Georgia's electric utility organizations, regulatory authorities, and
- security agencies; and
- 24 (6) It is the intent of the General Assembly that such cooperation be conducted in such a
- 25 manner so as to preserve the confidential nature of certain elements of the grid system but
- also to ensure that the system is satisfactorily protected.

SECTION 2.

28 Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 46 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to

- 29 generation and distribution of electricity generally, is amended by adding a new part to read
- 30 as follows:

31 "<u>Part 5</u>

- 32 <u>46-3-68.</u>
- 33 (a) All electrical utilities in this state, both publicly and privately owned, shall develop and
- 34 <u>implement a plan to address the vulnerability of the electrical transmission grid system</u>
- 35 <u>within their boundaries to natural and nuclear electromagnetic pulse and other manmade</u>
- or natural acts that could pose a threat to local, state, or national security. The plan shall
- 37 <u>uniformly be called 'THE PLAN OF THE (NAME OF ELECTRIC UTILITY) TO</u>
- 38 PROTECT THE ELECTRICAL TRANSMISSION GRID SYSTEM WITHIN ITS
- 39 <u>BOUNDARIES FROM MANMADE OR NATURAL ACTS OF DISRUPTION, 'referred</u>
- 40 <u>to in this Code section as the 'grid security plan'.</u>
- 41 (b) A utility's grid security plan shall include:
- 42 (1) A description of the electrical grid system within its jurisdictional boundaries;
- 43 (2) An analysis of potential manmade and natural short-term, medium-term, and
- 44 <u>long-term threats to the system;</u>
- 45 (3) The utility's plan for addressing such threats including the anticipated costs of
- 46 <u>implementing such plan;</u>
- 47 (4) The timetable for implementation based upon a prioritization of vulnerabilities and
- 48 <u>mitigation measures; and</u>
- 49 (5) A plan to ensure a minimum 72 hour back-up electrical supply for critical community
- 50 <u>infrastructure</u>.
- 51 (c) Each grid security plan shall be reviewed by independent electromagnetic pulse experts
- 52 and both the grid security plan and expert review shall be submitted to both the adjutant
- 53 general and the director of the Georgia Emergency Management Agency no later than
- 54 <u>December 31, 2016. The adjutant general and the director of the Georgia Emergency</u>
- 55 <u>Management Agency shall review each grid security plan and jointly submit a report to the</u>
- 56 Governor stating their comments and recommendations no later than February 28, 2017.
- 57 The Governor shall then approve, conditionally approve, or disapprove the grid security
- 58 plans.
- 59 (d) The grid security plans prepared by the electric utilities as well as the report prepared
- 60 by the adjutant general and the director of the Georgia Emergency Management Agency
- shall be deemed to be classified and protected by applicable laws and regulations and

62	exempt from public disclosure and open records publication under Article 4 of Chapter 18
63	of Title 50 and other applicable laws regarding public inspection and disclosure.
64	(e) The costs borne by the utilities in both the development and implementation of the grid
65	security plans shall be deemed to be recoverable cost items to be paid by consumers as
66	determined by the Georgia Public Service Commission.
67	(f) The adjutant general and the director of the Georgia Emergency Management Agency
68	shall develop their own action plans within 90 days consistent with the grid security plans
69	as approved or conditionally approved by the Governor.
70	(g) The adjutant general and the director of the Georgia Emergency Management Agency
71	shall coordinate with their counterparts in the states comprising the regional grid system

as well as with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to assist in the development of
