A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 48-5-7.4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to bona
- 2 fide conservation use property, residential transitional property, application procedures,
- 3 penalties for breach of covenant, classification on tax digest, and annual report, so as to
- 4 provide an exception to a breach of covenant and qualified use for bona fide conservation use
- 5 property; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Code Section 48-5-7.4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to bona fide
- 9 conservation use property, residential transitional property, application procedures, penalties
- 10 for breach of covenant, classification on tax digest, and annual report, is amended by revising
- 11 subsection (u) as follows:

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- 12 "(u) Reserved Notwithstanding any other provision of this Code section to the contrary,
- in the case of property that an owner has previously renewed without an intervening lapse
- 14 the covenant for bona fide conservation use and that owner has reached the age of 65 or
- older, when such owner seeks to renew the covenant or reenter a covenant subsequent to
- the termination of a previous covenant which met such requirements, but the property is
- 17 <u>no longer being used for the qualified use for which the previous covenant was entered, the</u>
- primary use of the property shall be deemed the maintenance of a wildlife habitat, so long
- 19 <u>as such owner maintains the property in its natural condition or allows the land to lie fallow</u>
- 20 <u>or idle. Upon the property owner's death or a change in ownership of such property, such</u>

covenant shall be deemed breached without penalty and the preferential assessment shall

- be removed. A new owner of such property shall be required to meet the generally
- 23 applicable conditions for a preferential assessment pursuant to this Code section."

SECTION 2.

25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
