AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 5 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 2 libraries, so as to prohibit the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia and city, 3 county, and regional public library trustees from using any taxpayer or privately donated 4 funds, with limited exception, on any materials, services, or operations offered by the 5 American Library Association or any of its affiliates; to amend Chapter 80 of Title 36 of the 6 Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to provisions applicable to counties, municipal 7 corporations, and other governmental entities, so as to prohibit taxpayer or privately donated 8 funds, with limited exception, from going to the American Library Association or any of its 9 affiliates; to amend Chapter 24 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 10 relating to librarians, so as to dissolve the State Board for the Certification of Librarians and, 11 in lieu thereof, provide new authorities to the Georgia Council of Public Libraries; to amend 12 Part 1 of Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 13 relating to general authority, duties, and procedure of the Department of Administrative Services, so as to prohibit the acceptance of any bid or proposal made by the American 14 15 Library Association for a state contract; to provide for legislative findings; to provide for an 16 effective date; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other 17 purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

19	SECTION 1.
20	The General Assembly finds the following:
21	(1) The bureaucracy that has developed around the certification of librarians has become
22	heavily intertwined with and influenced by the American Library Association;
23	(2) The President of the American Library Association has declared herself to be a
24	Marxist;
25	(3) The American Library Association has used the librarian certification process to
26	promote its ideology;
27	(4) The vast majority of residents of this state do not want their tax dollars to directly or
28	indirectly support such an ideology;
29	(5) Other states have begun reducing the influence of the American Library Association;
30	(6) The Georgia Library Association is an affiliate of the American Library Association;
31	(7) The Georgia Library Association should no longer be an affiliate of the American
32	Library Association; and
33	(8) The Georgia Council of Public Libraries is well suited to assume responsibilities
34	concerning the certification of librarians and related duties.
35	SECTION 2.

36 Chapter 5 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to libraries, is 37 amended in Code Section 20-5-2, relating to powers and duties of the board of regents and 38 director of University of Georgia Libraries, abolition of State Library Commission and 39 transfer of functions, reports of state publications, and electronic submission, by revising 40 subsections (a) and (b) as follows:

41 "(a) The board of regents shall give aid, advice, and counsel to all libraries and to
42 communities which may propose to establish libraries as to the best means of establishing

43 and administering them, the selection of books, cataloging, and other details of library 44 management and shall exercise supervision over all public libraries and endeavor to 45 improve libraries already established. The board of regents may also conduct a 46 book-lending and information service for the benefit of the citizens of the state, free of cost 47 except postage. The board of regents is also authorized to purchase books, periodicals, and 48 other instructional materials for such purposes. The board of regents may also employ 49 necessary professional and clerical staff to carry on the work as stated in this Code section 50 and may pay their necessary traveling expenses while engaged in such work. The board 51 of regents shall not use any taxpayer or privately donated funds on any materials, services, 52 or operations offered by the American Library Association or any of its affiliates, except 53 that privately donated funds may be provided to such association for the sole purpose of supporting an application for accreditation or re-accreditation of a degree program. 54 55 (b) The board of regents shall have authority to accept gifts of books, money, or other

(b) The board of regents shall have authority to accept gifts of books, money, or other property from any public or private source, including the federal government, and shall have authority to perform any and all functions necessary to carry out the intention and purposes of this article. <u>Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no such gifts</u> shall be provided to the American Library Association or any of its affiliates."

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SECTION 3.

61 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 20-5-20, relating to power of city

62 to tax and appropriate and election of trustees to control library funds, as follows:

63 "20-5-20.

Any city, through its properly constituted municipal authorities, may raise by taxation from year to year and permanently appropriate money for the purpose of establishing, erecting, maintaining, or assisting in maintaining a public library. Any such sum or sums of money so appropriated shall be expended by and under the direction of a board of trustees of such public library elected by the city council of such city. Notwithstanding any provision of

- 69 law to the contrary, no such sum or sums of money shall be provided to the American
 70 Library Association or any of its affiliates."

SECTION 4.

72 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 20-5-44, relating to compensation

73 of trustees, as follows:

74 "20-5-44.

75 Members of the board of trustees shall receive no compensation; provided, however, that 76 such members may be reimbursed for any reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in 77 the performance of library business or if stipulated in terms of any bequest or gift. Dues 78 or fees for membership in local, state, regional, and national library associations may be 79 paid from operating funds in accordance with the constitution and bylaws of the library 80 system. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, dues or fees for membership 81 in the American Library Association shall not be paid from such funds or any other public 82 moneys."

SECTION 5.

84 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 20-5-45, relating to directors of 85 library systems, duties, and responsibilities, as follows:

86 "20-5-45.

Every public library system shall have a director. Any person appointed as director of a public library system must hold at least a Grade 5(b) <u>a</u> Librarian's Professional Graduate Certificate, as defined by the <u>Georgia Council of Public Libraries</u> State Board for the <u>Certification of Librarians; provided, however, that any person who was serving as acting</u> director of a public library system as of July 1, 1984, shall be authorized to continue to serve as director. The director shall be appointed by the board of trustees and shall be the administrative head of the library system under the direction and review of the board. The 94 director of a library system shall have duties and responsibilities which include but are not

95 limited to the following:

- 96 (1) To recommend for employment or termination other staff members, as necessary, in
 97 compliance with applicable laws and the availability of funds and to employ or terminate
 98 other staff members if so authorized by the library board;
- 99 (2) To attend all meetings called by the Office of Public Library Services of the Board
- 100 of Regents of the University System of Georgia or send a substitute authorized by the
- 101 office director;
- 102 (3) To prepare any local, state, or federal annual budgets;
- 103 (4) To notify the board of trustees and the Office of Public Library Services of the Board
- 104 of Regents of the University System of Georgia of any failure to comply with:
- 105 (A) Policies of the board;
- 106 (B) Criteria for state aid;
- 107 (C) State and federal rules and regulations; and
- 108 (D) All applicable local, state, or federal laws;
- 109 (5) To administer the total library program, including all affiliated libraries, in
- 110 accordance with policies adopted by the system board of trustees; and
- 111 (6) To attend all meetings of the system board of trustees and affiliated boards of trustees
- 112 or to designate a person to attend in his or her place."

SECTION 6.

- 114 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 20-5-56, relating to requirement
- 115 of certification of librarians, as follows:
- 116 "20-5-56.
- 117 All persons holding professional positions with the title of librarian must be certified by the
- 118 Board for the Certification of Librarians Georgia Council of Public Libraries."

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119	SECTION 7.
120	Chapter 80 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to provisions
121	applicable to counties, municipal corporations, and other governmental entities, is amended
122	by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
123	" <u>36-80-32.</u>
124	No county, municipality, school district, authority, division, instrumentality, political
125	subdivision, or public body corporate created under the Constitution or laws of this state
126	shall be authorized to use any taxpayer or privately donated funds on materials, services,
127	or operations offered by the American Library Association or any of its affiliates, except
128	that privately donated funds may be provided to such association for the sole purpose of
129	supporting an application for accreditation or re-accreditation of a degree program."
130	SECTION 8.
131	Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and businesses,
132	is amended by revising Chapter 24, relating to librarians, as follows:
133	"CHAPTER 24
134	43-24-1.
135	As used in this chapter, the term:

(1) 'Board' means the State Board for the Certification of Librarians. 136

(1) 'Council' means the Georgia Council of Public Libraries. 137

(2) 'Librarian' means a person with specialized training as identified in this chapter and 138

in the administrative rules and regulations applicable to this chapter and possessing the 139

necessary training and qualifications to plan, organize, communicate, and administer 140

successfully the use of the library's materials and services. 141

142 (3) 'Library' means an organization providing services and informational materials in a

143 variety of formatting, including, but not limited to, books, films, tapes, microforms, and

144 periodicals and having no fewer than 3,000 items which have been selected, acquired, and

145 organized for dissemination.

146 43-24-2.

147 (a) The State Board for the Certification of Librarians is created, to consist of six persons148 as follows:

(1) Three librarians certified under this chapter, including one public librarian, one
special librarian, and one other currently practicing librarian, and one person who shall
be a trustee of a public library;

(2) A member to be appointed from the public at large who shall have no connectionwhatsoever with the library profession; and

(3) The director of public library services of the Board of Regents of the UniversitySystem of Georgia.

(b) The members referred to in paragraphs (1) and (2) of subsection (a) of this Codesection shall be appointed by the Governor and shall be confirmed by the Senate.

(c) The terms of the five members appointed pursuant to paragraphs (1) and (2) of
subsection (a) of this Code section shall be five years. The term of the director of public
library services of the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia shall be
coextensive with the term of office of this position.

162 (d) Members of the board shall be reimbursed as provided for in subsection (f) of Code163 Section 43-1-2.

(e) If there is a vacancy on the board, the Governor shall appoint a member to serve theunexpired term.

- 166 (f)(1) The provisions of subsections (a) through (e) of this Code section shall stand
- 167 repealed and the State Board for the Certification of Librarians shall be dissolved

168 effective July 1, 2025, and all authorities and responsibilities of such board shall become

169 the authorities and responsibilities of the council in accordance with this chapter.

- 170 (2) Any contracts entered into by the board shall expire or terminate by such date.
- 171 (3) The council shall make such rules and regulations and take such action as may be
- 172 reasonably necessary to implement this chapter.
- 173 43-24-3.
- 174 The same jurisdiction, duties, powers, and authority which the division director has with
- 175 reference to other professional licensing boards is conferred upon that director with respect

176 to the board council.

177 43-24-4.

178 Any public library serving a political subdivision or subdivisions having a population of 179 over 5,000 according to the United States decennial census of 1970 or any future such 180 census and every library operated by the state or its authority, including libraries of 181 institutions of higher learning, shall not employ in the position of librarian a person who 182 does not hold a librarian's certificate issued by the board council. No public funds shall be 183 paid to any library failing to comply with this chapter, provided that nothing in this chapter 184 shall apply to law libraries of counties and municipalities, to libraries of public elementary 185 and high schools, or to libraries of the University System of Georgia.

187 The board <u>council</u> shall have authority to establish grades of certificates for librarians, to 188 prescribe and hold examinations, to require submission of credentials to establish the 189 qualifications of those seeking certificates as librarians, and to issue certificates of 190 librarianship to qualified persons in accordance with such rules and regulations as it may

- prescribe. <u>The council shall not, however, require any person to obtain a degree from a</u>
 program accredited by the American Library Association.
- 193 43-24-6.
- (a) All applicants for a librarian's certificate shall file an application with the division
 director, accompanied by a fee which shall be set by the board council.
- 175 director, decompanied by a ree which shall be set by the board <u>eo</u>
- 196 (b) Each certificate issued shall be renewable biennially.
- 197 (c) Any certified librarian requesting a duplicate certificate shall be charged a fee as shall
- 198 be set by the board <u>council</u>.
- 199 43-24-7.

200 (a) The board council shall be authorized to require persons holding a certificate under this

201 chapter to complete board <u>council</u> approved continuing education of not less than ten hours

biennially as a condition of certificate renewal. The board <u>council</u> shall be authorized to
approve programs offered by professional associations, educational institutions,
government agencies, and bibliographic utilities, and others as it deems appropriate.

(b) The board <u>council</u> shall be authorized to waive the continuing education requirement
 in cases of hardship, disability, or illness or under such other circumstances as the board

- 207 <u>council</u> deems appropriate.
- 208 (c) The board <u>council</u> shall be authorized to promulgate rules and regulations to implement
- and ensure compliance with the requirements of this Code section.
- 210 (d) The board council shall have the authority to appoint a committee or committees
- 211 composed of certified librarians, as it deems appropriate, to administer, implement, and
- 212 otherwise carry out the provisions of this chapter relating to continuing education."

213	SECTION 9.
214	Part 1 of Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
215	relating to general authority, duties, and procedure of the Department of Administrative
216	Services, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
217	" <u>50-5-84.3.</u>
218	The Department of Administrative Services shall not accept any bid or proposal made by
219	the American Library Association or any of its affiliates for a state contract."
220	SECTION 10.
221	This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2025.
222	SECTION 11.

223 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
