A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 10 of Chapter 7 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to the Defense Community Economic Development Fund, so as to create the Georgia
- 3 Joint Defense Commission; to provide for the membership and purposes of such commission;
- 4 to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6	SECTION 1.
7	Article 10 of Chapter 7 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
8	Defense Community Economic Development Fund, is amended by adding a new Code
9	section to read as follows:
0	" <u>50-7-126.</u>
1	(a)(1) There is hereby created the Georgia Joint Defense Commission. Such commission
12	shall consist of 18 members as follows:
13	(A) The chairpersons of the House Committee on Defense and Veterans Affairs and
4	the Senate Veterans, Military and Homeland Security Committee;
15	(B) The chairpersons of the House Committee on Economic Development and Tourism
6	and the Senate Economic Development and Tourism Committee:

- 17 (C) Two members of the House of Representatives, one each from the majority party
- and the minority party, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 19 (D) Two members of the Senate, one each from the majority party and the minority
- 20 party, appointed by the Lieutenant Governor;
- 21 (E) One citizen member from each of the state's eight military installation regions
- 22 <u>appointed by the Governor;</u>
- 23 (F) The director of the Governor's Defense Initiative; and
- 24 (G) The commissioner of economic development or her or her designee.
- 25 (2) The members of the commission appointed pursuant to subparagraphs (A)
- 26 <u>through (D) of paragraph (1) of this subsection shall serve two-year terms.</u>

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27 (3) The members of the commission appointed pursuant to subparagraph (E) of

- 28 paragraph (1) of this subsection shall serve four-year terms, provided that of the initial
- 29 <u>appointees, two shall serve an initial two-year term, two shall serve an initial three-year</u>
- 30 <u>term, and four shall serve an initial four-year term.</u>
- 31 (4) The members of the commission appointed pursuant to subparagraphs (F) and (G)
- of paragraph (1) of this subsection shall serve the duration of their respective terms in
- 33 <u>office</u>.
- 34 (5) The commission shall elect a chairperson from among its membership. The
- 35 <u>commission shall meet at such times and places as it deems necessary or convenient to</u>
- 36 perform its duties. The commission shall also meet upon the written call of the director
- of the Governor's Defense Initiative, or of three of its members. The commission shall
- 38 <u>maintain minutes of its meetings and such other records at it deems necessary.</u>
- 39 (6) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation, but shall receive for
- 40 <u>each day of attendance at commission meetings a daily expense allowance in the amount</u>
- 41 specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21, plus reimbursement for actual
- 42 <u>transportation costs while traveling by public carrier, or the legal mileage rate for use of</u>
- 43 <u>a personal car in connection with such attendance.</u>
- 44 (7) Members of the commission shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor, President of
- 45 <u>the Senate, or Speaker of the House of Representatives, in accordance with who</u>
- 46 <u>appointed them.</u>
- 47 (b) The Georgia Joint Defense Commission shall:
- 48 (1) Advise the Governor and the General Assembly on defense and military issues within
- 49 <u>the state and nationally;</u>
- 50 (2) Make recommendations regarding policies and plans to support the long-term
- 51 <u>viability and development of the military, both active and civilian, in this state;</u>
- 52 (3) Develop methods to assist defense-dependent communities in the design and
- 53 execution of programs that enhance each community's relationship with military
- 54 <u>installations and defense-related business;</u>
- 55 (4) Serve as a task force to seek advice on and prepare for potential base realignment or
- 56 <u>closure of military installations in the state;</u>
- 57 (5) Develop and implement a plan to navigate potential base realignment or closure of
- 58 military installations studies and proceedings; and
- 59 (6) Produce and distribute a detailed report no later than December 1, 2018, and annually
- 60 thereafter, regarding the status of the state's military installations, as well as a strategic
- 61 plan for navigating any potential base realignment or closure of military installations in
- 62 <u>the state. Such annual reports shall be distributed to the Governor and the General</u>
- 63 Assembly and shall be made publicly available."

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64 SECTION 2.

65 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
