A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 7 of Chapter 6 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to negotiating railroad crossings and entering highways from private driveways, so
- 3 as to require that persons driving vehicles shall exercise due care and caution for other
- 4 on-track equipment, as for trains, at railroad grade crossings; to provide for a definition; to
- 5 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 7 of Chapter 6 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 negotiating railroad crossings and entering highways from private driveways, is amended by
- 10 revising Code Section 40-6-140, relating to obedience to signal indicating approach of train
- and reasonable and prudent standard for crossing railroad grade, as follows:
- *"*40-6-140.
- 13 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'other on-track equipment' means any car, rolling
- stock, or other device that, alone or coupled to another device, is operated on stationary
- rails.

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- 16 (b) Whenever any person driving a vehicle approaches a railroad grade crossing, such
- driver shall stop within 50 feet but not less than 15 feet from the nearest rail of such
- railroad and shall not proceed until he <u>or she</u> can do so safely, when:
- 19 (1) A clearly visible electric or mechanical signal device gives warning of the immediate
- approach of a train;
- 21 (2) A crossing gate is lowered or a human flagman gives or continues to give a signal of
- 22 the approach of the passage of a train or other on-track equipment; or
- 23 (3) An approaching train or other on-track equipment is plainly visible and is in
- 24 hazardous proximity to such crossing.

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25 (b)(c) No person shall drive any vehicle through, around, or under any crossing gate or barrier at a railroad crossing while such gate or barrier is closed or is being opened or 26 27 closed. 28 (c)(d) If no electric or mechanical signal device is giving warning of the immediate 29 approach of a train or other on-track equipment, no crossing gate or barrier is closed, there 30 is no stop sign at the crossing, and there is no human flagman giving warning, all drivers 31 shall slow to a reasonable and prudent speed and verify that there is no approaching train 32 or other on-track equipment prior to proceeding. For the purposes of this subsection, 'a 33 reasonable and prudent speed' means a speed slow enough to enable the driver to safely stop the vehicle prior to reaching the nearest rail of such crossing. 34 35 (d)(e) No person shall drive a vehicle over a railroad grade crossing when a train or other 36 on-track equipment is approaching. (e)(f) No person shall drive a vehicle over a railroad grade crossing if there is insufficient 37 38 space to drive completely through the crossing without stopping. (f)(g) No person shall drive a vehicle over a railroad grade crossing if there is insufficient 39 40 undercarriage clearance for the vehicle to negotiate the crossing."

41 SECTION 2.

42 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
