## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 2 Georgia Bureau of Investigation, so as to establish the Georgia Information Sharing and
- 3 Analysis Center within the Georgia Bureau of Investigation; to provide for a fusion center
- 4 for the sharing and analysis of homeland security activity information; to provide for
- 5 definitions; to provide for operations and responsibilities; to provide for membership; to
- 6 amend Code Section 38-3-20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to Georgia
- 7 Emergency Management Agency created, director, staff, offices, director's duties, and
- 8 disaster coordinator, so as to expand the duties of the director of emergency management;
- 9 to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 12 Chapter 3 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Georgia
- 13 Bureau of Investigation, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:
- 14 "ARTICLE 9
- 15 <u>35-3-200.</u>

- 16 As used in this article, the term:
- 17 (1) 'Center' means the Georgia Information Sharing and Analysis Center.
- 18 (2) 'Fusion center' means collaborative effort which combines resources, expertise,
- intelligence, and other information from various agencies of state and local governments
- with the goal of maximizing the ability of this state to detect, prevent, and respond to
- 21 <u>criminal activities or to otherwise engage in homeland security activities.</u>
- 22 (3) 'Homeland security activity' means any activity related to the prevention or discovery
- of, response to, or recovery from:
- 24 (A) A terrorist attack;

- 25 (B) A hostile military or paramilitary action;
- 26 (C) An extraordinary law enforcement emergency; or
- 27 (D) A fire or medical emergency requiring resources beyond the capabilities of a local
- 28 <u>jurisdiction</u>.
- 29 <u>35-3-201.</u>
- 30 There is established the Georgia Information Sharing and Analysis Center within the
- 31 Georgia Bureau of Investigation. The center shall be a fusion center maintaining a
- 32 <u>terrorism analytical component.</u>
- 33 35-3-202.
- 34 (a) Responsibility for the development, maintenance, and operations of the center shall be
- 35 <u>vested in the director.</u>
- 36 (b) The director shall appoint and maintain the necessary professional and support staff to
- 37 <u>enable the center to effectively and efficiently carry out its duties and responsibilities under</u>
- 38 this article.

- 40 (a) The director through the center shall share and provide homeland security activity
- 41 <u>information to the director of emergency management, including, but not limited to,</u>
- 42 <u>threats, warnings, and developing situations, when an investigation reveals conduct of a</u>
- 43 <u>terroristic nature or in material support of terroristic activities, recruitment of terrorists, or</u>
- 44 <u>information on the activities of known terrorist organizations.</u>
- 45 (b) The center shall liaise with the bureau, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Joint
- 46 Terrorism Task Force, United States Department of Homeland Security, and other local,
- 47 <u>state, and federal intelligence and law enforcement officials for purposes of carrying out</u>
- 48 <u>its duties and responsibilities under this article.</u>
- 49 (c) The center shall allow unrestricted access to secure communications equipment to the
- 50 <u>director of emergency management and his or her representatives who possess the</u>
- 51 appropriate federally approved security clearances for the dissemination of homeland
- 52 security activity information by the United States Department of Homeland Security.
- 53 (d) The director of emergency management shall serve as this state's security manager for
- 54 the purpose of identifying and processing state personnel for security clearances through
- 55 <u>the United States Department of Homeland Security.</u>

57 (a) Membership in the center shall consist of the director, the director of emergency

58 management, the commissioner of public safety, the commissioner of natural resources, the

59 <u>commissioner of corrections, the state fire marshal, the Attorney General, and the adjutant</u>

60 general of this state. Such persons shall assign or make available their analysts or other

61 personnel to the center as such need is determined by the director.

62 (b) The director, in consultation with the director of emergency management, shall provide

63 for further membership in the center to consist of other state or local law enforcement,

64 <u>emergency management, and intelligence officials or their analysts or personnel as</u>

65 <u>homeland security activity needs arise and change."</u>

SECTION 2.

67 Code Section 38-3-20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to Georgia

68 Emergency Management Agency created, director, staff, offices, director's duties, and

69 disaster coordinator, is amended by revising subsection (e) as follows:

70 "(e) The director, subject to the direction and control of the Governor, shall be the

executive head of the Georgia Emergency Management Agency and shall be responsible

to the Governor for carrying out the program for emergency management in this state. He

or she shall coordinate the activities of all organizations for emergency management within

the state, shall maintain liaison with and cooperate with emergency management agencies

and organizations of other states and of the federal government, and shall have such

additional authority, duties, and responsibilities authorized by Article 1, this article, and

Article 3 of this chapter as may be prescribed by the Governor and such additional

authority, duties, and responsibilities as described in <u>Article 9 of Chapter 3 of Title 35 and</u>

Part 4 of Article 2 of Chapter 5 of Title 46, the 'Georgia Emergency Telephone Number

9-1-1 Service Act of 1977,' as amended."

SECTION 3.

82 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
