The Senate Committee on Health and Human Services offered the following substitute to SB 420:

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED <br> AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 26-2-25 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 2 licensing of food sales establishments, so as to direct the Department of Agriculture to 3 establish rules and regulations relating to the public use of restroom facilities in food sales 4 establishments; to provide that if a food sales establishment permits members of the public 5 to use its restroom facilities, it must do so without discriminating on the basis of race, color, 6 religion, national origin, sex, disability, or age and must maintain the restrooms in a clean 7 and serviceable condition; to provide for penalties for noncompliance; to provide that no 8 food sales establishment shall be required to permit members of the public to use its restroom 9 facilities; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting 0 laws; and for other purposes.

## SECTION 1.

Code Section 26-2-25 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to licensing of food sales establishments, is amended by adding a new subsection to read as follows:

[^0](3) A provision that in the event a food sales establishment allows persons other than employees of the food sales establishment to access restroom facilities, including but not limited to handwashing sinks and toilets, said restroom facilities shall be subject to inspection by the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Public Health, and the county boards of health, acting as duly authorized agents of the Department of Public Health;
(4) A provision requiring food sales establishments that do not allow persons other than employees of the food sales establishment to access restroom facilities, including but not limited to handwashing sinks and toilets, to provide public notice in a conspicuous and appropriate place near the entrance of the food sales establishment that restroom facilities are not available for public use;
(5) Provisions for penalties for noncompliance with the rules and regulations established pursuant to this subsection, including but not limited to a penalty for aggravated noncompliance that suspends the food sales establishment from participation in sign programs offered by the Georgia Department of Transportation until such time as the food sales establishment is deemed compliant following an inspection provided for in the rules and regulations established pursuant to this subsection; and
(6) A statement that nothing in the rules and regulations established pursuant to this subsection shall be deemed to require that food sales establishments allow persons other than employees of the food sales establishments to access restroom facilities, including but not limited to handwashing sinks and toilets."

## SECTION 2.

48 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2020.

## SECTION 3.

50 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.


[^0]:    "(d) The Department of Agriculture shall establish rules and regulations relating to public use of restroom facilities, including:
    (1) A statement providing that in the event a food sales establishment allows persons other than employees of the food sales establishment to access restroom facilities, including but not limited to handwashing sinks and toilets, the food sales establishment shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, disability, or age relating to access to said restroom facilities of the food sales establishment;
    (2) A requirement that in the event a food sales establishment allows persons other than employees of the food sales establishment to access restroom facilities, including but not limited to handwashing sinks and toilets, said restroom facilities shall be maintained in a clean and serviceable condition;
