## AS PASSED SENATE

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 10 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 2 Georgia Board for Physician Workforce, so as to change the name of the Georgia Board for
- 3 Physician Workforce to the Georgia Board of Health Care Workforce; to provide a
- 4 definition; to add advanced practice registered nurses to the board's powers, duties, and
- 5 responsibilities; to expand the board's membership; to amend the the Official Code of
- 6 Georgia Annotated so as to conform cross-references; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 7 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 Chapter 10 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Georgia
- Board for Physician Workforce, is amended in Code Section 49-10-1, related to board for
- 12 physician workforce, composition, expense allowances, staffing, and advisory committees,
- 13 by revising subsection (a) as follows:
- 14 "(a)(1) The Joint Board of Family Practice which existed on January 1, 1998, is
- 15 continued in existence but on and after July 1, 1998, shall become and be known as the
- Georgia Board for Physician Workforce. The Georgia Board for Physician Workforce
- which existed on January 1, 2018, is continued in existence but on and after July 1, 2018,
- shall become and be known as the Georgia Board of Health Care Workforce, referred to
- in this chapter as the 'board,' <u>and</u> shall be attached to the Department of Community
- Health for administrative purposes only, as defined by Code Section 50-4-3, except that
- such department shall prepare and submit the budget for that board in concurrence with
- that board.

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- 23 (2) As used in this chapter, the term 'health care practitioners' means professionals
- 24 <u>licensed as an audiologist, chiropractor, clinical social worker, dentist, dental hygienist,</u>
- 25 <u>dietitian, medical doctor, marriage and family therapist, registered professional or</u>
- 26 <u>licensed practical nurse, occupational therapist, optometrist, osteopathic physician,</u>
- 27 pharmacist, physical therapist, physician assistant, professional counselor, podiatrist,

28 psychologist, radiological technician, respiratory therapist, or speech-language

- 29 <u>pathologist.</u>
- 30 (2)(3) The Georgia Board for Physician Workforce Georgia Board of Health Care
- 31 Workforce shall be composed of 15 16 members, all of whom are residents of this state,
- 32 as follows:
- 33 (A) Five members shall be primary care physicians, at least three of whom shall be
- from rural areas;
- 35 (B) Five members shall be physicians who are not primary care physicians, at least
- three of whom shall practice in rural areas;
- 37 (C) Three members shall be representatives of hospitals which are not teaching
- hospitals, with at least two of those three members being representatives of rural,
- 39 nonprofit hospitals;
- 40 (D) One member shall be a representative of the Georgia Nursing Leadership
- 41 <u>Coalition</u>;
- 42 (D)(E) One member shall be a representative from the business community;
- 43 (E)(F) One member shall have no connection with the practice of medicine or the
- 44 provision of health care; and
- 45 (F)(G) The physicians on the board shall represent a diversity of medical disciplines,
- including, but not limited to, women's health, geriatrics, and children's health. The
- board shall represent the gender, racial, and geographical diversity of the state.
- 48 (3)(4) All members of the board shall be appointed by the Governor and confirmed by
- 49 the Senate. The terms of office of all the members of the Joint Board of Family Practice
- 50 shall expire July 1, 1998 Georgia Board for Physician Workforce shall expire
- 51 <u>July 1, 2018</u>, but only at such time on or after that date when all 15 16 of the initial
- members of the Georgia Board of Physician Workforce Georgia Board of Health Care
- 53 <u>Workforce</u> have been appointed and qualified. No such initial member shall exercise any
- 54 power under this chapter until all 15 16 members have been appointed and qualified. The
- initial members of the board who are appointed thereto shall take office for initial terms
- of office as follows:
- 57 (A) Two primary care physicians, two physicians who are not primary care physicians,
- and one representative of a hospital which is not a teaching hospital shall be appointed
- to two-year terms of office;
- (B) Two primary care physicians, two physicians who are not primary care physicians,
- and one representative of a hospital which is not a teaching hospital shall be appointed
- to four-year terms of office; and
- 63 (C) The remainder of the board shall be appointed to six-year terms of office.

Thereafter, successors to such members shall be appointed for terms of six years. The Governor shall designate the term to which each initial member is appointed. All 65 members shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified. Members 66 appointed under this paragraph shall be eligible to serve on the board until confirmed by 67 the Senate at the session of the General Assembly next following their appointment. 68 69 (4)(5) In case of a vacancy on the board by reason of death or resignation of a member 70 or for any other cause other than the expiration of the member's term of office, the board shall by secret ballot elect a temporary successor. If the General Assembly is in session, 72 the temporary successor shall serve until the end of that session. If the General Assembly 73 is not in session, the temporary successor shall serve until the end of the session next 74 following the vacancy or until the expiration of the vacated member's term of office, 75 whichever occurs first. The Governor shall appoint a permanent successor who shall be confirmed by the Senate. The permanent successor shall take office on the first day after 76 77 the General Assembly adjourns and shall serve for the unexpired term and until his or her 78 successor is appointed and qualified. 79 (5)(6) The office on the board of a member thereof who fails to attend more than three 80 consecutive regular meetings of the board, without excuse approved by resolution of the board, shall become vacant."

82 **SECTION 2.** 

83 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 49-10-3, relating to powers, duties, 84 and responsibilities, as follows:

"49-10-3. 85

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The board shall have the following powers, duties, and responsibilities: 86

(1) To locate and determine specific underserved areas of the state in which unmet priority needs exist for physicians, advanced practice registered nurses, and health care practitioners by monitoring and evaluating the supply and distribution of physicians, advanced practice registered nurses, and health care practitioners by specialty and geographical location;

- 92 (2) To award service cancelable loans and scholarships pursuant to Part 6 of Article 7 of
- 93 Chapter 3 of Title 20, Chapter 34 of Title 31, or as otherwise provided by law;
- (3) To approve and allocate state appropriations for family practice training programs, 94
- including but not limited to fellowships in geriatrics and other areas of need as may be 95
- identified by the board; 96
- 97 (4) To approve and allocate state appropriations for designated pediatric training
- 98 programs;

99 (5) To approve and allocate any other state funds appropriated to the Georgia Board for Physician Workforce Georgia Board of Health Care Workforce to carry out its purposes;

- 101 (6) To coordinate and conduct with other state, federal, and private entities, as
- appropriate, activities to increase the number of graduating physicians and health care
- practitioners who remain in Georgia to practice with an emphasis on medically
- underserved areas of the state;
- 105 (7) To apply for grants and to solicit and accept donations, gifts, and contributions from
- any source for the purposes of studying or engaging one or more contractors to study
- issues relevant to medical education or implementing initiatives designed to enhance the
- medical education infrastructure of this state and to meet the physician and other health
- care practitioners workforce needs of Georgia communities; and
- 110 (8) To carry out any other functions assigned to the board by general law."

111 SECTION 3.

- 112 The Official Code of Georgia Annotated is amended by replacing "Georgia Board for
- 113 Physician Workforce" with "Georgia Board of Health Care Workforce" wherever the former
- 114 term occurs in:
- 115 (1) Code Section 20-3-510, relating to board defined relative to medical scholarships.
- 116 (2) Code Section 20-3-513, relating to determination of amount by board, terms and
- 117 conditions, and repayment in services relative to medical scholarships.
- 118 (3) Code Section 31-7-95, relating to funding of medical education provided by hospital
- authorities and designated teaching hospitals.
- 120 (4) Code Section 31-34-2, relating to purpose and intent of chapter relative to physicians for
- 121 rural areas assistance.
- 122 (5) Code Section 31-34-3, relating to administration by Georgia Board for Physician
- Workforce.
- 124 (6) Code Section 45-7-21, relating to expense allowance and travel cost reimbursement for
- members of certain boards and commissions.
- 126 (7) Code Section 48-7-161, relating to definitions relative to setoff debt collection.

127 SECTION 4.

128 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
