The House Committee on Education offers the following substitute to SB 440:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 2 relating to the "Quality Basic Education Act," so as to provide for the Accelerated Career 3 Diploma Program; to provide a short title; to establish and provide for the ACE Grants 4 program; to provide for ACE (accelerated career education) grants for technical college 5 students pursuing certain degrees, diplomas, and certificates; to provide for reporting; to provide for the adoption of content standards for a minimum course of instruction in 6 foundations of algebra; to revise a definition in the "Dual Enrollment Act"; to revise 7 8 provisions relating to the maximum of eligible dual enrollment courses allowable for 9 students; to make conforming changes; to extend an automatic repeal; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes. 10

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

Said article is further amended in Part 4, relating to financing, by revising paragraph (7) of subsection (b), paragraph (3) of subsection (f), and subsection (g) of Code Section 20-2-161.3, relating to the "Dual Enrollment Act," purpose, dual credit courses, eligibility for participation, and eligibility for payment, as follows:
