A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 36-33-5 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 written demand prerequisite to action for injury to person or property, time for presenting
- 3 claim and for consideration by governing authority, suspension of limitations, statement of
- 4 specific amount of monetary damages sought, and service of claim on city officials, so as to
- 5 revise the time for presenting a claim to a municipal governing authority; to provide for
- 6 applicability; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 7 purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 Code Section 36-33-5 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to written demand
- 11 prerequisite to action for injury to person or property, time for presenting claim and for
- 12 consideration by governing authority, suspension of limitations, statement of specific amount
- 13 of monetary damages sought, and service of claim on city officials, is amended by revising
- 14 subsection (b) as follows:
- 15 "(b) Within six months one year of the happening of the event upon which a claim against
- a municipal corporation is predicated, the person, firm, or corporation having the claim
- shall present the claim in writing to the governing authority of the municipal corporation
- 18 for adjustment, stating the time, place, and extent of the injury, as nearly as practicable, and
- 19 the negligence which caused the injury. No action shall be entertained by the courts
- against the municipal corporation until the cause of action therein has first been presented
- 21 to the governing authority for adjustment."
- SECTION 2.
- 23 This Act shall apply to the happening of events upon which a claim is based that occurs on
- 24 and after July 1, 2018.
