A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 14A of Chapter 7 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to the central caregiver registry, so as to add disabled persons to the registry; to
- 3 provide for definitions; to provide for related matters; to provide an effective date; to repeal
- 4 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Article 14A of Chapter 7 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 8 the central caregiver registry, is amended by revising Code Section 31-7-380, relating to the
- 9 purpose and intent of the caregiver registry, as follows:
- 10 "31-7-380.

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- 11 The purpose of this article is to enable employers who are family members or guardians
- of elderly persons or disabled persons to obtain an employment eligibility determination
- from the department for applicants who are seeking to provide and employees who are
- providing personal care services to their family members or wards. It is the intent of the
- 15 General Assembly to allow the department to establish and maintain a caregiver registry
- so as to provide such employers with access to employment eligibility determinations

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17 conducted by the department in a similar manner as licensed facilities receive employment

determinations as provided in Article 14 of this chapter."

19 SECTION 2.

20 Said article is further amended by revising Code Section 31-7-381, relating to definitions,

- 21 as follows:
- 22 "31-7-381.
- As used in this article, the term:
- 24 (1) 'Applicant' means an individual applying to provide personal care services to an
- elderly <u>or disabled</u> person in a residence or location not licensed by the department.
- 26 (2) 'Criminal background check' means a search of the criminal records maintained by
- 27 Georgia Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation to determine
- whether an applicant or employee has a criminal record.
- 29 (2.1) 'Disabled person' means an adult or child who is mentally or physically
- incapacitated or has Alzheimer's disease or has dementia.
- 31 (3) 'Elderly person' means an individual who is 65 years of age or older.
- 32 (4) 'Employee' means any individual who is providing personal care services to an
- elderly <u>or disabled</u> person in a residence or location not licensed by the department.
- 34 (5) 'Employer' means an individual who is considering an applicant or has hired an
- 35 employee for a family member or ward <u>or themselves</u>, if they meet the statutory criteria
- and are independent. Such term shall include entities arranging care for Medicaid
- 37 <u>members through structured family caregiving.</u>
- 38 (6) 'Family member' means an individual with a close familial relationship, including,
- but not limited to, a spouse, parent, sibling, or grandparent.
- 40 (7) 'Personal care services' means home care, health care, companionship, or
- 41 transportation and includes, but is not limited to, providing assistance with bathing,
- 42 eating, dressing, walking, shopping, fixing meals, and housework.

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43 (8) 'Registry check' means a review of the nurse aide registry provided for in Code 44 Section 31-2-14, the state sexual offender registry, and the List of Excluded Individuals 45 and Entities as authorized in Sections 1128 and 1156 of the federal Social Security Act, 46 as it existed on February 1, 2018, or any other registry useful for the administration of 47 this article as specified by rules of the department.

(9) 'Ward' means an elder elderly or disabled person for whom a guardian has been appointed pursuant to Title 29."

50 SECTION 3.

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51 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
