## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 5 of Chapter 4 of Title 26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to prescription drugs, so as to require practitioners to issue electronic prescriptions
- 3 for certain controlled substances; to provide for definitions; to provide for exceptions; to
- 4 provide for penalties; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 5 purposes.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7	SECTION 1.
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- 8 Article 5 of Chapter 4 of Title 26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 prescription drugs, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 10 "<u>26-4-80.2.</u>
- 11 (a) For purposes of this Code section, the term:
- 12 (1) 'Controlled substance' means a controlled substance that is classified as a Schedule II
- or III controlled substance under Code Section 16-13-26 or 16-13-27, respectively, or
- under the federal Controlled Substances Act, 21 U.S.C. Section 812.
- 15 (2) 'Practitioner' or 'practitioner of the healing arts' means, notwithstanding Code
- Section 26-4-5, a person licensed as a dentist, physician, podiatrist, or veterinarian under
- 17 <u>Chapter 11, 34, 35, or 50, respectively, of Title 43.</u>
- 18 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Code section or any other law to the
- 19 contrary, effective January 1, 2020, no practitioner shall issue any prescription for a
- 20 controlled substance in this state unless such practitioner issues such prescription
- 21 <u>electronically to a pharmacy in accordance with standards established by the board, except</u>
- 22 <u>for any prescription:</u>
- 23 (1) Issued by a veterinarian;
- 24 (2) Issued when there is temporary technological or electrical failure pursuant to rules
- 25 <u>and regulations promulgated by the board pursuant to this Code section;</u>

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26 (3) To be dispensed by a pharmacy located outside the state pursuant to rules and

- 27 <u>regulations promulgated by the board pursuant to this Code section;</u>
- 28 (4) Issued when the prescriber and dispenser are the same entity;
- 29 (5) Which includes elements that are not supported by the most recently implemented
- 30 <u>version of the National Council of Prescription Drug Programs Prescriber/Pharmacist</u>
- 31 <u>Interface SCRIPT Standard;</u>
- 32 (6) Required by the federal Food and Drug Administration to contain certain elements
- 33 <u>that are not supported by electronic prescribing;</u>
- 34 (7) That is a nonpatient specific prescription permitted to be dispensed pursuant to a
- 35 <u>standing order, an approved protocol for drug therapy, or collaborative drug management</u>
- or comprehensive medication management; in response to a public health emergency; or
- 37 <u>due to other circumstances in which the practitioner may issue a nonpatient specific</u>
- 38 <u>prescription;</u>
- 39 (8) Issued under a research protocol;
- 40 (9) Issued by a practitioner who has received a waiver or a renewal thereof for a
- 41 specified period of time determined by the Georgia Composite Medical Board, such
- 42 <u>period of time not to exceed one year, exempting such practitioner from the requirement</u>
- 43 <u>to issue prescriptions electronically pursuant to a process established by rules and</u>
- 44 <u>regulations promulgated by the Georgia Composite Medical Board in consultation with</u>
- 45 <u>such board due to economic hardship, technological limitations that are not reasonably</u>
- within the control of the practitioner, or other extenuating circumstances; and
- 47 (10) Issued under circumstances in which, notwithstanding the practitioner's present
- 48 <u>ability to issue an electronic prescription as required by this subsection, such practitioner</u>
- 49 <u>reasonably determines that it would be impractical for the patient to obtain the drug that</u>
- was prescribed electronically in a timely manner and such delay would adversely impact
- 51 <u>the patient's medical condition.</u>
- 52 (c) A pharmacist who receives a written, oral, or faxed prescription from a practitioner is
- 53 not required to verify that such practitioner is exempt from the requirement to issue
- 54 prescriptions electronically pursuant to subsection (b) of this Code section. Pharmacists
- 55 <u>may continue to dispense drugs from otherwise valid written, oral, or faxed prescriptions</u>
- 56 that are consistent with Code Section 26-4-80 or any other applicable laws and regulations.
- 57 (d) A violation of any provision of this Code section shall be punishable by a civil fine in
- an amount not to exceed \$500.00 for each violation. The prosecuting attorney or the
- 59 Attorney General shall be authorized to prosecute the civil case."

60 SECTION 2.

61 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
