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The Senate Committee on Regulated Industries and Utilities offered the following substitute to SB 471:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and
- 2 businesses, so as to change the expiration and renewal dates for certain licenses and
- 3 certificates issued by certain professional licensing boards; to provide for exceptions and for

- 6 provide for related matters; to provide for effective dates; to repeal conflicting laws; and for

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and businesses,
- is amended by revising Code Section 43-1-4, relating to expiration, renewal, and penalty
- dates of licenses and certificates, duration of validity, and renewals, as follows:
- 13 "43-1-4.
- 14 (a) The division director shall determine the expiration, renewal, and penalty dates for
- each license and certificate issued by the professional licensing boards through the office
- of the division director which is subject to renewal. Before becoming effective, these

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17 expiration, renewal, and penalty dates must shall be approved by the respective 18 professional licensing boards though rules and regulations. 19 (b)(1) On and before December 31, 2024, each Each license and certificate issued by the 20 professional licensing boards through the office of the division director which are that is 21 subject to renewal shall be valid for up to two years and shall be renewable biennially on 22 the renewal date established by the division director, as approved by the respective 23 professional licensing boards through rules and regulations. (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law specific to each professional licensing 24 board, each license and certificate issued by the professional licensing boards through the 25 office of the division director on and after January 1, 2025, that is subject to renewal shall 26 be valid for up to four years and shall be renewable on the renewal date established by 27 the division director, as approved by the respective professional licensing boards through 28 29 rules and regulations. 30 (c) The division director is authorized to adopt the necessary rules and regulations to implement the biennial renewal of licenses and certificates in such manner as to ensure that 31 32 the number of renewals is reasonably evenly distributed throughout each two-year 33 four-year period. 34 (d) The provisions of this Code section shall not be applicable to the renewal of licenses 35 and certificates under the professional licensing boards established under Chapters 9, 10A, 11A, 26 through 30, 33, 35, 39, 44, and 50 of this title. Instead, each license and certificate 36 37 issued by such professional licensing boards through the office of the division director that is subject to renewal shall be valid for up to two years and shall be renewable biennially 38 on the renewal date established by the division director, as approved by the respective 39

professional licensing boards through rules and regulations."

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- 42 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 43-6-11.2, relating to expiration of
- 43 licenses, waiver of continuing education requirement, and rules and regulations, as follows:
- 44 "43-6-11.2.
- 45 (a) Licenses for auctioneers shall expire biennially as provided in Code Section 43-1-4.
- The commission shall be authorized to require persons seeking renewal of an auctioneer's
- license under this chapter to complete commission approved continuing education of not
- 48 more than eight hours biennially.
- 49 (b) The commission shall be authorized to waive the continuing education requirement in
- cases of hardship, disability, or illness or under such other circumstances as the
- 51 commission deems appropriate.
- 52 (c) The commission shall be authorized to promulgate rules and regulations to implement
- and ensure compliance with the requirements of this Code section.
- 54 (d) This Code section shall apply to each biennial renewal cycle which begins after the
- 55 1990-1991 renewal."

SECTION 3.

- 57 For purposes of proposing rules and regulations, this Act shall become effective upon its
- 58 approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval. For all other
- 59 purposes, this Act shall become effective on July 1, 2024.

SECTION 4.

61 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
