A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 12 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 commissions and other agencies, so as to create the Equity and Reconciliation Commission
- 3 of Georgia; to provide for membership and operation; to provide for an executive director;
- 4 to provide for an advisory committee; to provide for powers and duties; to provide for
- 5 definitions; to provide that the commission may accept outside funding from public or
- 6 private grants, devises, and bequests; to provide for reporting; to provide for related matters;
- 7 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 Chapter 12 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to commissions
- 11 and other agencies, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:

12 "ARTICLE 9

- 13 <u>50-12-150.</u>
- 14 (a) There is created the Equity and Reconciliation Commission. The commission shall be
- 15 <u>composed of 11 members to be appointed as follows:</u>
- 16 (1) Three members shall be appointed by Governor;
- 17 (2) Two members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 18 (3) Two members shall be appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 19 (4) Two members shall be appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of
- 20 Representatives; and
- 21 (5) Two members shall be appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate.
- 22 (b) The members of the commission shall be individuals of recognized ability and
- 23 achievement with knowledge and experience in matters pertaining to equity and
- 24 reconciliation.
- 25 (c) All vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term by the original appointing official.
- 26 Members shall serve for terms of four years and shall be eligible for successive
- 27 appointments by an appointing official. Any member with four consecutive unexcused
- 28 <u>absences from regular monthly meetings may be removed from the commission by the</u>
- 29 appointing official. Each person appointed to the commission shall be a full-time resident
- 30 of Georgia. Any member who ceases to be a full-time resident of this state during the term
- 31 of his or her membership shall be removed from the commission and such vacancy shall
- 32 <u>be filled by the Governor. Any member may be removed from office by the appointing</u>
- 33 <u>authority when the actions or condition of that member are considered to be good cause for</u>
- 34 removal.
- 35 (d) The commission shall be assigned to the Department of Community Affairs for
- 36 <u>administrative purposes only, as prescribed in Code Section 50-4-3.</u>

- 38 (a) The commission shall elect a chairperson, vice chairperson, and a secretary from
- 39 among its members annually, and any member shall be eligible for successive election to
- 40 <u>such office by the commission.</u>
- 41 (b) A quorum for transacting business shall be a majority of the members of the
- 42 commission.
- 43 (c) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation but shall be eligible to
- 44 receive reimbursement for mileage and other expenses actually incurred in performance
- 45 of their duties in accordance with the rates and standards for reimbursement of state
- 46 <u>employees.</u>
- 47 (d) The commission shall appoint an executive director from among its staff who shall
- 48 manage the work of the commission. The commission may delegate to such executive
- 49 director the powers and duties as it deems proper. Such staff member shall not be an
- 50 employee of the State of Georgia and shall serve without compensation, but shall be
- 51 eligible to receive reimbursement for mileage and other expenses actually incurred in
- 52 performance of his or her duties as executive director in accordance with the rates and
- 53 standards for reimbursement of state employees.
- 54 (e) The commission shall appoint an advisory committee to the commission that shall
- consist of representation from organizations and persons with experience and expertise in
- 56 matters of equity and reconciliation. The commission shall use the advisory committee to
- inform and advance the work of the commission.

- 59 (a) For purposes of this article, the term:
- 60 (1) 'Equity' means the state, quality, or ideal of being just, impartial, and fair.
- 61 (2) 'Reconciliation' means the promotion of unity and the amelioration and restoration
- of constituent relationships throughout this state.

- 63 (b) The commission shall have the following powers and duties:
- 64 (1) To undertake a study of the conditions, needs, issues, and problems related to
- 65 <u>fostering equity and reconciliation in the State of Georgia;</u>
- 66 (2) To review and analyze the laws of the State of Georgia and their impact on equity
- and reconciliation in this state;
- 68 (3) To initiate research, execute initiatives, recommend policies, and propose legislation
- 69 to further equity and promote reconciliation throughout this state;
- 70 (4) To collect and disseminate information regarding the status of equity and
- 71 <u>reconciliation in the State of Georgia and the nation;</u>
- 72 (5) To consult with and advise the Governor and any state department, agency, board,
- commission, or authority on matters pertaining to equity and reconciliation;
- 74 (6) To cooperate with the government of the United States and the governments of other
- 75 <u>states in programs relating to equity and reconciliation;</u>
- 76 (7) To accept public or private grants, devises, and bequests; and
- 77 (8) To hold public hearings, conduct studies, or take any other action the commission
- deems necessary to fulfill its responsibilities.
- 79 (c) The commission shall be authorized to enter into all contracts or agreements necessary
- 80 <u>or incidental to the performance of its duties.</u>
- 81 (d) All executive departments, agencies, boards, commissions, and authorities shall
- 82 cooperate with the commission in the performance of its duties.
- 83 <u>50-12-153.</u>
- 84 The commission is authorized to solicit and accept donations, contributions, grants,
- 85 bequests, gifts of money and property, facilities, or services, with or without consideration,
- 86 from any person, firm, or corporation or from any state, county, municipal corporation, or
- 87 local government or governing body to enable it to carry out its functions and purpose. The

88 commission is prohibited from paying or compensating any member of the General

- 89 Assembly, directly or indirectly, any amount in excess of expenses.
- 90 <u>50-12-154.</u>
- 91 On the first Monday after January 1 of each year, the commission shall post electronically
- 92 on the Department of Community Affairs internet website an annual report summarizing
- 93 the activities, findings, and recommendations of the commission. Such report shall also
- be submitted to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President
- of the Senate, and all members of the House of Representatives and the Senate."
