A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- To amend Article 4 of Chapter 4 of Title 17 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 1
- 2 relating to arrest by private persons, so as to repeal the article in its entirety; to amend
- Titles 17, 35, and 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to criminal 3
- procedure, law enforcement officers and agencies, and professions and businesses, 4
- 5 respectively, so as to make conforming changes; to provide for related matters; to provide
- for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes. 6

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

- 9 Article 4 of Chapter 4 of Title 17 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 10 arrest by private persons, is repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 2. 11

- Title 17 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to criminal procedure, is 12
- 13 amended by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (c) of Code Section 17-6-1, relating to
- 14 where offenses bailable, procedure, schedule of bails, and appeal bonds, as follows:
- ''(c)(1) In the event a person is detained in a facility other than a municipal jail for an 15
- offense which is bailable only before a judge of the superior court, as provided in 16
- subsection (a) of this Code section, and a hearing is held pursuant to Code 17
- Section 17-4-26 or 17-4-62, the presiding judicial officer shall notify the superior court 18
- in writing within 48 hours that the arrested person is being held without bail. If the 19
- detained person has not already petitioned for bail as provided in subsection (d) of this
- Code section, the superior court shall notify the district attorney and shall set a date for 21
- a hearing on the issue of bail within 30 days after receipt of such notice." 22

23 SECTION 3.

- 24 Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to law enforcement officers and
- agencies, is amended by revising subsection (d) of Code Section 35-2-102, relating to weight
- 26 inspector positions, training, powers and responsibilities, and limits on responsibilities, as
- 27 follows:
- 28 "(d) A weight inspector is not a peace officer and shall not be authorized to carry a firearm
- or exercise any power of arrest other than a citizen's arrest in accordance with Code
- 30 Sections 17-4-60 and 17-4-61. At all times while a weight inspector is on duty, there shall
- 31 be a supervisor over the weight inspector also on duty who shall be a certified peace
- 32 officer."
- 33 SECTION 4.
- 34 Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and businesses,
- 35 is amended by revising Code Section 43-38-13, relating to arrest powers of licensees and
- 36 registrants of the Georgia Board of Private Detective and Security Agencies, as follows:
- 37 "43-38-13.
- 38 Licensees or registrants under this chapter shall have the same power of arrest as that
- 39 granted to a private person by Code Section 17-4-60 Reserved."
- 40 SECTION 5.
- 41 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 42 without such approval.
- **SECTION 6.**
- 44 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
