A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Subpart 2 of Part 6 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of
- 2 Georgia Annotated, relating to conditions of employment under the "Quality Basic Education
- 3 Act," so as to provide for the placement of certificated professional personnel on the state
- 4 minimum salary schedule; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
- 5 other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Subpart 2 of Part 6 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 9 Annotated, relating to conditions of employment under the "Quality Basic Education Act,"
- 10 is amended by revising Code Section 20-2-212, relating to salary schedules, as follows:
- 11 "20-2-212.
- 12 (a)(1) The State Board of Education shall establish a schedule of minimum salary
- schedule salaries for services rendered which shall be on a ten-month basis and which
- shall be paid by local units of administration to the various classifications of professional
- personnel required to be certificated by the Professional Standards Commission.

16 (2) The minimum salary schedule shall provide a minimum salary base for each 17 classification of professional personnel required to be certificated; shall provide for 18 increment increases above the minimum salary base of each classification based upon 19 individual experience and length of satisfactory service; and shall include such other 20 uniformly applicable factors as the state board may find relevant to the establishment of such a schedule. 21 22 (3) The minimum salary base for certificated professional personnel with bachelor's 23 degrees and no experience, when annualized from a ten-month basis to a 12 month basis, 24 shall be comparable to the beginning salaries of the recent graduates of the University 25 System of Georgia holding bachelor's degrees and entering positions, excluding 26 professional educator teaching positions, in Georgia having educational entry 27 requirements comparable to the requirements for entry into Georgia public school 28 teaching. 29 (4) The placement of teachers certificated professional personnel on the minimum salary 30 schedule shall be based on: certificate level and years 31 (A) Years of creditable experience, except that a teacher certificated professional 32 personnel shall not receive credit for any year of experience in which the teacher he or 33 she received an unsatisfactory or ineffective annual summative performance evaluation 34 or for the second consecutive year in which a teacher he or she receives two 35 consecutive an annual summative needs development ratings rating pursuant to Code 36 Section 20-2-210; and 37 (B) Certificate level; provided, however, that, effective July 1, 2025, placement on the 38 minimum salary schedule of certificated professional personnel shall not be based on 39 having a leadership degree unless such leadership degree was earned in conjunction 40 with the completion of an educator leadership preparation program approved by the 41 Professional Standards Commission; and provided, further, that until July 1, 2025, 42 placement on the minimum salary schedule of certificated professional personnel shall

43 not be based on having a leadership degree, including, but not limited to, a degree 44 earned in conjunction with completion of an educator leadership preparation program approved by the Professional Standards Commission, unless the certificated 45 46 professional personnel is currently employed in a leadership position as defined by the 47 State Board of Education. 48 (b) The General Assembly shall annually appropriate funds to implement a minimum 49 salary schedule for certificated professional personnel as provided for in subsection (a) of 50 this Code section. For each state fiscal year, the state board of Education shall 51 adopt the minimum salary schedule for which funding has been appropriated by the 52 General Assembly. 53 (c) A local unit of administration shall not pay to any full-time certificated professional 54 employee personnel a salary less than that prescribed by the schedule of minimum salary 55 schedule salaries, except as required by this Code section; nor shall a local unit of 56 administration pay to any part-time certificated professional employee less than a pro rata 57 portion of the respective salary prescribed by the schedule of minimum salary schedule 58 salaries, except as required by this Code section. 59 (d) For purposes of this subsection Code section, an educator's the placement of 60 certificated professional personnel on the minimum salary schedule shall not be based on 61 a leadership degree, which shall mean a degree earned in conjunction with completion of 62 an educator leadership preparation program approved by the Professional Standards 63 Commission, unless the educator certificated professional personnel is employed in a 64 leadership position as defined by the State Board of Education, but shall be placed on the 65 minimum salary schedule position attributable to the educator but for the leadership degree; 66 provided, however, that this shall not apply, regardless of whether or not he or she is in a 67 leadership position, to: 68 (1) An educator Certificated professional personnel who possessed a leadership degree 69 prior to July 1, 2010; or

- 70 (2) An educator <u>Certificated professional personnel</u> who possessed:
- 71 (A) A master's level leadership degree prior to July 1, 2012;
- 72 (B) An education specialist level leadership degree prior to July 1, 2013; or
- 73 (C) A doctoral level leadership degree prior to July 1, 2014,
- so long as he or she was enrolled in such leadership preparation program on or before
- April 1, 2009. This subsection shall stand repealed and reserved on June 30, 2025.
- 76 (b)(e)(1) Local units of administration may supplement the salaries of certificated
- 77 <u>professional</u> personnel subject to the schedule of minimum salary schedule salaries under
- subsection (a) of this Code section and, in fixing the amount of those supplements, may
- take into consideration the nature of duties to be performed, the responsibility of the
- 80 position held, the subject matter or grades to be taught, and the experience and
- 81 performance of the particular employee certificated professional personnel whose salary
- is being supplemented.
- 83 (2) In any fiscal year in which such certificated professional personnel receive an
- increase under the minimum salary schedule, a local unit of administration shall not
- decrease any local salary supplement for such <u>certificated professional</u> personnel below
- the local supplement amount received in the immediately preceding fiscal year by those
- 87 <u>such certificated professional</u> personnel of that local unit of administration unless such
- local unit of administration has conducted at least two public hearings regarding such
- decrease, notice of which hearings, including the time, place, agenda, and specific subject
- matter of the meeting, the local unit shall cause to be published in the legal organ of the
- ounty which is the legal situs of such local unit one time at least seven days prior to the
- date such hearings are to be held. Written notice shall be provided to each employee
- 93 <u>certificated professional personnel</u> subject to the schedule of minimum salary schedule
- 94 salaries under subsection (a) of this Code section at least seven days prior to the date of
- 95 the hearings. Each such hearing shall be held and shall commence after school hours to
- allow certificated and noncertificated personnel to attend.

97 (e)(f) A local unit of administration shall pay beginning classroom teachers the first salary 98 payment for the number of days worked at the end of the first month of the school year in 99 which service is rendered. The State Board of Education shall develop rules and
