## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 43-38-7 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 licensing of armed employees, qualifications, continuing education, fingerprints, license card,
- 3 and suspension, so as to require that a criminal background check be performed prior to the
- 4 issuance of a license to an armed security guard; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.** 

- 8 Code Section 43-38-7 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to licensing of
- 9 armed employees, qualifications, continuing education, fingerprints, license card, and
- 10 suspension, is amended by revising subsections (c) and (d) as follows:
- 11 "(c)(1) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (2) of subsection (b) of this Code
- 12 section, upon being satisfied of the applicant's character, competency, and eligibility for
- 13 licensure, the board may license such applicant if he or she:
- 14 (A) Is at least 18 years of age;
- 15 (B) Is a citizen of the United States or a registered resident alien;
- 16 (C) Is of good moral character;
- 17 (D) Has After completion of a fingerprint based criminal history records check from
- 18 the Georgia Crime Information Center and Federal Bureau of Investigation,
- 19 demonstrates that he or she has not been convicted of a felony or any crime involving
- 20 the illegal use, carrying, or possession of a dangerous weapon or any crime involving
- moral turpitude; provided, however, that, if the applicant has been convicted of such 21
- crime, or has entered a plea of nolo contendere to such crime, or has entered a plea 23 pursuant to Article 3 of Chapter 8 of Title 42 or otherwise been granted first offender
- 24 treatment, the board may inquire into the nature of the crime, the date of conviction or
- 25 plea, and other underlying facts and circumstances surrounding such criminal
- proceedings and, in its discretion, may allow the applicant to be licensed; 26
- 27 (E) Has not committed an act constituting dishonesty or fraud; and

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(F) Meets such other qualifications as the board may prescribe by rule.

(2) The board shall be authorized to require continuing education as a condition of renewal for all persons required to be licensed or registered with the board under this chapter. The board shall be authorized to promulgate rules and regulations addressing the requirement for continuing education and circumstances for which a waiver of this requirement may be granted.

(d) The license application shall be made under oath and on a form to be furnished by the division director. The application shall state the applicant's full name, age, and date and place of birth; residences and employment within the past five years; experience in the position applied for or held; the date and place of conviction or arrest for any crime, including the entry of a plea of nolo contendere or the entry of a plea entered pursuant to Article 3 of Chapter 8 of Title 42 or other first offender treatment; and such other information as the board may require. The license application shall be accompanied by two sets of fingerprints of the applicant and one photograph of the applicant, two inches wide by three inches high, full face, and taken within six months prior to the application. The board shall have discretion to deny a license to any individual when the information and supporting documentation required by this subsection are not provided. The board shall not issue a license under this Code section until a fingerprint based criminal history records check from the Georgia Crime Information Center and Federal Bureau of Investigation has been completed."
