A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 5 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to ethics
 in government, so as to provide that child care and other caregiving services associated with
 a candidate's campaign constitute ordinary and necessary expenses of a campaign; to provide
 for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
 purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

8 Chapter 5 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to ethics in
9 government, is amended in Code Section 21-5-3, relating to definitions, by revising
10 paragraph (18) and adding a new paragraph to read as follows:

"(4.1) 'Caregiving services' means direct care, protection, and supervision of a child or
 other person with a disability or medical condition for whom a candidate has direct
 caregiving responsibility."

14 "(18) 'Ordinary and necessary expenses' shall include, but shall not be limited to, 15 expenditures made during the reporting period for qualifying fees; office costs and rent; 16 lodging; equipment; travel; advertising; postage; staff salaries; consultants; files 17 storage; polling; special events; volunteers, reimbursements to volunteers; repayment of any loans received except as restricted under subsection (i) of Code Section 21-5-41;
contributions to nonprofit organizations;
flowers for special occasions, which shall
include, but are not limited to, birthdays and funerals;
attorney fees connected to and in
the furtherance of the campaign;
caregiving services in direct connection with the
candidate's campaign activity; and all other expenditures contemplated in Code
Section 21-5-33."

SECTION 2.

25 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law26 without such approval.

27 **SECTION 3.**

28 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
