A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state government,
- 2 so as to create the Georgia Commission on African American History and Culture; to provide
- 3 for duties and objectives; to provide for membership and terms of office; to provide for
- 4 reporting; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state government, is amended
- 8 by adding a new chapter to read as follows:
- 9 "<u>CHAPTER 41</u>
- 10 50-41-1.
- 11 (a) There is created the Georgia Commission on African American History and Culture
- 12 <u>(GCAAHC).</u>

13 (b) The GCAAHC shall discover, document, preserve, collect, and promote Georgia's

- 14 African American heritage with a primary focus on educating the citizens of this state
- 15 <u>about the significance of the African American experience in Georgia.</u>
- 16 (c)(1) The primary objectives of the GCAAHC shall be to:
- 17 (A) Cultivate, present, interpret, and promote the history and culture of African
- Americans in the State of Georgia through museum collections, exhibitions,
- 19 commemorations, educational programs, publications, research, and public
- 20 <u>participation</u>;
- 21 (B) Serve as a clearinghouse and authenticator for information and insights about
- 22 African Americans in Georgia and the nation through collaboration with other public,
- 23 <u>educational, corporate, and Georgia based institutions on strategies for promoting</u>
- 24 <u>African American history and culture</u>;
- 25 (C) Discover, preserve, collect, and catalog African American historical materials and
- 26 <u>artifacts and establish, manage, approve, and coordinate museums and other appropriate</u>
- 27 <u>facilities for the promotion of African American history and culture; and</u>
- 28 (D) Disseminate and integrate African American historical and cultural materials into
- 29 <u>the mainstream of Georgia life and education as a method of fostering constructive</u>
- 30 <u>social change through better racial understanding.</u>
- 31 (2) The GCAAHC shall provide technical assistance to institutions and groups with
- 32 <u>similar objectives.</u>
- 33 <u>50-41-2.</u>
- 34 (a) The Georgia Commission on African American History and Culture shall be composed
- of 20 members.
- 36 (b) Said members shall be appointed as follows:
- 37 <u>(1) On or before August 1, 2021:</u>

38 (A) Two members shall be appointed by the Governor, one member shall be appointed 39 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one member shall be appointed by the 40 President of the Senate, and one member shall be appointed by the Georgia Legislative 41 Black Caucus to each serve a one-year term; 42 (B) Two members shall be appointed by the Governor, one member shall be appointed 43 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one member shall be appointed by the 44 President of the Senate, and one member shall be appointed by the Georgia Legislative 45 Black Caucus to each serve a two-year term; 46 (C) Two members shall be appointed by the Governor, one member shall be appointed 47 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one member shall be appointed by the 48 President of the Senate, and one member shall be appointed by the Georgia Legislative 49 Black Caucus to each serve a three-year term; and 50 (D) Two members shall be appointed by the Governor, one member shall be appointed 51 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one member shall be appointed by the 52 President of the Senate, and one member shall be appointed by the Georgia Legislative 53 Black Caucus to each serve a four-year term; and 54 (2) Upon the expiration of the individual terms provided for in paragraph (1) of this 55 subsection and upon any term expiring thereafter, the respective appointing authorities 56 shall appoint successors who shall each serve four-year terms. 57 50-41-3. 58 (a) The Governor shall designate one of the members appointed pursuant to Code Section 50-41-2 to serve as the chairperson of the GCAAHC at the Governor's pleasure. 59

- 60 (b) The chairperson shall call all meetings of the GCAAHC.
- 61 (c) A vice chairperson shall be selected by a majority of sitting members of the GCAAHC.
- 62 (d) The GCAAHC shall meet on a quarterly basis at different locations within this state,
- 63 particularly in rural areas of this state, interacting with local government officials,

64 <u>educational leaders, healthcare providers, business leaders, civic groups, and all other</u>

- 65 citizens who desire to offer input, so as to enable the GCAAHC to exercise fully and
- 66 effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of
- 67 this Code section.
- 68 (e) Members of the GCAAHC shall serve at no expense to the State of Georgia.
- 69 50-41-4.
- On or before December 31, 2022, the GCAAHC shall issue a comprehensive report of
- 71 recommendations for the establishment of the Museum of Georgia African American
- 72 History and Culture. Such report shall include information on the proposed location of the
- 73 facility and a comprehensive plan for the implementation of fundraising efforts for
- 74 construction and for ongoing support of the facility thereafter."

75 **SECTION 2.**

76 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
