Senate Resolution 10

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging Congress to require the identification of minors boarding domestic flights; and for
- 2 other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, more than 50,000 women and children are trafficked into the United States for
- 4 sexual purposes each year, with an estimated total of 700,000 such victims in the last decade;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, girls as young as seven years old have been found in the international sex trade
- 7 market, and girls as young as nine years old have been found in the sex trade occurring in the
- 8 United States; and
- 9 WHEREAS, sex trafficking of women and children is a multibillion dollar industry and is
- 10 often linked to organized crime, pornography, and other types of human trafficking; and
- 11 WHEREAS, although adults must show identification prior to boarding domestic flights,
- 12 there is no such requirements for minors, which makes transporting children for illegal
- 13 purposes over long distances ridiculously easy; and
- 14 WHEREAS, requiring minors and the adults accompanying them on flights to prove the
- 15 minor's stated identity would greatly strengthen child safety and assist law enforcement and
- 16 prosecutors in their fight against human trafficking.
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 GEORGIA that the members of this body urge Congress to enact legislation requiring the
- 19 positive identification of minors boarding domestic flights in this country.
- 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 21 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Georgia delegation to Congress, the
