A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing October 7-11, 2019, as Georgia Pre-K Week at the state capitol; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Georgia's Pre-K program was started by Governor Zell Miller in 1992 as a pilot
- 4 program that originally served 750 students and that now provides quality early education
- 5 experiences to more than half of the state's four-year-old children; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Georgia's Pre-K program has helped to prepare approximately 1.6 million of
- 7 Georgia's children for success in kindergarten and beyond; and
- 8 WHEREAS, children in Georgia's Pre-K program show significant gains across all learning
- 9 domains, regardless of differences in gender and income, and recently released findings from
- 10 the longitudinal study conducted by the Frank Porter Graham Child Development Institute
- showed that these gains were sustained through the end of first grade; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Georgia's Pre-K program recognizes two outstanding educators, one from a
- public school system and one from a private child care center, as Georgia's Pre-K Program
- 14 Teachers of the Year for 2018-2019; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the Pre-K Program Teachers of the Year are Becky Thomas-Haden from
- 16 Mulberry Creek Elementary in Cataula, Georgia, and Stephanie Westhafer from Georgia
- 17 Kids Academy in Hoschton, Georgia; and
- 18 WHEREAS, there is a growing commitment to improving the quality of child care in
- 19 Georgia with more than 3,500 programs participating in Quality Rated, the voluntary quality
- 20 improvement system for child care programs; and

21 WHEREAS, the early care and education industry is crucial to Georgia's economy,

- 22 generating \$4.7 billion of economic activity annually and providing approximately 68,000
- 23 jobs in the industry itself and 17,000 jobs in other market segments; and
- 24 WHEREAS, the early care and education industry in Georgia cares for an estimated 337,000
- 25 children per year in approximately 6,200 early care and education centers, including family
- 26 child care homes, group child care homes, Pre-K programs, military family child care homes,
- 27 Head Start sites, and military early care and education centers; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Voices for Georgia's Children will be hosting Georgia Pre-K Week for the ninth
- 29 year in a row during the first full week of October; and
- 30 WHEREAS, members of the Junior League of Atlanta, including president Carla C. Smith
- 31 and president-elect Andrea N. Smith, join in celebrating Georgia's Pre-K program; and
- 32 WHEREAS, Reach Out and Read Georgia and the Ferst Foundation for Childhood Literacy
- 33 will provide quality Pre-K books to legislators as a part of its commitment toward improving
- and early literacy in children throughout the state.
- 35 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 36 recognize October 7-11, 2019, as Georgia Pre-K Week at the state capitol; thank the
- 37 hundreds of teachers, aides, and staff who have built a nationally recognized Pre-K program;
- 38 and encourage parents, educators, community members, and business leaders to participate
- 39 in Georgia Pre-K Week and to support high-quality, accessible, and affordable early
- 40 education for all children in the State of Georgia.
- 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 42 to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to Voices for
- 43 Georgia's Children.
