## ADOPTED SENATE

## A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the Senate Educating Adult Students Study Committee; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, providing educational opportunities to individuals who, for a variety of reasons,

3 have not attained a high school diploma or a general educational development (GED)

4 diploma by the age of 20 is consistent with the state's obligations under Article VIII of the

5 Constitution of Georgia; and

6 WHEREAS, there are unmet employment opportunities in Georgia for adults who are 21

7 years of age or older and who have attained a high school diploma or a GED diploma; and

8 WHEREAS, meeting the demand for qualified individuals to engage such employment9 opportunities is a critical workforce development issue; and

WHEREAS, the state has an obligation to tailor its education system to help meet thisdemand to prevent the stifling of economic growth; and

12 WHEREAS, study is needed to evaluate:

13 (1) Methods and manners of expanding opportunities for adults in Georgia who are 21

- 14 years of age or older to complete their secondary education and attain a high school15 diploma or a GED diploma;
- (2) The number of adults in Georgia who are 21 years of age or older and who have not
   attained a high school diploma or GED diploma but would like the opportunity to attain
   a diploma;
- (3) The types and models of programs needed for adults in Georgia who are 21 years of
  age or older to attain a high school diploma or GED diploma;
- (4) Whether changes to elementary and secondary school curricula and policies should
  be recommended to the State Board of Education to support workforce development by
  providing for adults in Georgia who are 21 years of age or older to attain a high school
  diploma or GED diploma;

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- 25 (5) Whether changes to curricula and policies should be recommended for the Technical
- 26 College System of Georgia;
- 27 (6) Whether changes to policies should be recommended for the State Charter Schools
- 28 Commission of Georgia; and
- (7) Whether any related budget recommendations should be made. 29

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE: 30

31 (1) Creation of Senate study committee. There is created the Senate Educating Adult 32 Students Study Committee.

33 (2) Members and officers. The committee shall be composed of four members of the 34 Senate, including the chairperson of the Education and Youth Committee, the chairperson 35 of the Higher Education Committee, and two additional members of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate. The President shall also appoint an additional 36 37 three nonlegislative members of the committee as follows: the State School 38 Superintendent or his or her designee; the commissioner of the Technical College System of Georgia or his or her designee; and the executive director of the State Charter Schools 39 40 Commission of Georgia or his or her designee. The chairperson of the Education and 41 Youth Committee shall be designated by the President of the Senate to serve as 42 chairperson of the committee.

43 (3) Powers and duties. The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs, 44 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or 45 legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.

46 (4) Meetings. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or 47 48 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and 49 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

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## (5) Allowances, expenses, and funding.

(A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided 51 52 for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.

(B) Members of the committee who are state officials, other than legislative members, 53 or state employees shall receive no compensation for their services on the committee, 54 but they may be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the performance of their 55 duties as members of the committee in the same manner as they are reimbursed for 56 expenses in their capacities as state officials or employees. 57

58 (C) The allowances and expenses authorized by this resolution shall not be received 59 by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come 60

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from funds appropriated to the Senate; except that funds for the reimbursement of the
expenses of state officials, other than legislative members, and state employees shall
come from funds appropriated to or otherwise available to their respective agencies.

64 (6) **Report.** 

(A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

(B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
of this paragraph.

(C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.

74 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with75 the Secretary of the Senate.

76 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary

of the Senate a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.

78 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2020.
