ADOPTED SENATE

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the Senate Study Committee on Certificate of Need Reform; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Georgia's Certificate of Need laws have remained static despite significant
- 3 changes in the delivery and cost of health care; and
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- 5 WHEREAS, hospitals, doctors, and other providers must work together to meet the challenge
- 6 of delivering services with better outcomes at a lower cost; and
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- 8 WHEREAS, Georgia needs additional health care facilities to meet the needs of patients,
- 9 particularly in mental health, surgery, and emergency settings; and
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- 11 WHEREAS, rural hospitals face an ongoing financial crisis, and Certificate of Need policies
- 12 should be aligned to support the survival and growth of rural hospitals; and
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- 14 WHEREAS, reforms should preserve the ability of hospitals to continue to provide open
- 15 access to all patients in a community; and
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- 17 WHEREAS, legislation accomplishing these goals should be recommended by a study
- 18 committee and considered by the Georgia State Senate in the 2019 legislative session.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

20 (1) **Creation of Senate study committee.** There is created the Senate Study Committee

- 21 on Certificate of Need Reform.
- (2) Members and officers. The committee shall be composed of 13 members to beappointed by the Lieutenant Governor as follows:
- (A) Five members of the Senate of whom at least three members will have professional
 backgrounds in health care and at least two members shall be appointed from the
- backgrounds in health care and at least two members shall be appointed from the
 minority party. The Lieutenant Governor shall designate a member of the committee
 as chairperson of the committee.

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28 (B) A citizen representative who serves in an executive role in a nonprofit health 29 system; 30 (C) A citizen representative who serves in an executive role in a for-profit health 31 system; (D) A citizen representative who serves in an executive role in a rural hospital; 32 33 (E) A citizen representative who practices medicine as a full-time employee of a health 34 system; 35 (F) A citizen representative who practices medicine as an independent physician; 36 (G) A citizen representative who has expertise in health care costs and works in the 37 insurance industry; and 38 (H) Two consumer representatives. 39 (3) Powers and duties. The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,

40 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or41 legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.

42 (4) Meetings. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
 43 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
 44 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
 45 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

46 (5) Allowances and funding.

47 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
48 for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.

(B) Members of the committee who are not legislators, state officials, or state
employees shall receive a daily expense allowance in an amount the same as that
specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 of the Official Code of Georgia
Annotated, as well as the mileage or transportation allowance authorized for state
employees.

(C) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
 of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds
 necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
 appropriated to the Senate.

58 (6) **Report.**

(A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

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- 63 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for 64 proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) 65 of this paragraph. (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of 66 67 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee. A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with 68 69 the Secretary of the Senate. (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary 70 71 of the Senate a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 72 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2018.
