A RESOLUTION

1 Commending Charles Bloodworth upon the grand occasion of his retirement from the United
2 States Secret Service; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Charles Bloodworth has served with honor and distinction as a special agent
4 with the United States Secret Service since 1999; and

5 WHEREAS, he served in the United States Army from 1984 to 1988 and earned his
6 bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of West Georgia in 1991; and

7 WHEREAS, he is an honest and dedicated public servant who has a long and distinguished
8 career in law enforcement, serving in various capacities before his promotion to serve with
9 the United States Secret Service in 1999, including as a reserve deputy with the Fulton
10 County Sheriff's Office, a patrolman and precinct investigator with the Marta Police
11 Department, a deputy and narcotics investigator with the Douglas County Sheriff's Office,
12 and a law enforcement instructor with Douglas County Schools; and

13 WHEREAS, among his many responsibilities as a secret agent, he was tasked with
14 overseeing critical electronic crime and fraud investigations, directing network intrusion
15 responses, providing critical systems protection, and performing dignitary protection; and

16 WHEREAS, he further supervised up to several hundred internal and external law
17 enforcement and security agents on large projects, including complex foreign and domestic
18 security operations; and

19 WHEREAS, this spirited law enforcement professional has exhibited extraordinary devotion
20 to duty, outstanding loyalty, fine leadership, and meticulous attention to detail in all of his
21 duties; and

22 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that gratitude is expressed for the unique and
23 often unheralded contributions of law enforcement professionals on behalf of the citizens of
24 this state.

25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
26 commend the care, courage, sympathy, and selfless dedication exhibited by Charles
27 Bloodworth in carrying out the difficult duties of his vocation; congratulate him upon the
28 grand occasion of his retirement; and express their utmost appreciation for having so purely
29 and truly defined for others the meaning of public servant.
