ADOPTED SENATE

A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the Senate Study Committee on Medicaid Care Management Organizations

2 Credentialing; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, states are increasingly adopting managed care as a response to growing4 Medicaid expenditures; and

5 WHEREAS, credentialing is a necessary and critical first step in securing qualified 6 practitioners to render and manage care under Medicaid care management organizations; and

WHEREAS, federal regulations give states considerable latitude to create their own uniform
credentialing and recredentialing policies and procedures, and states are required to establish
uniform credentialing policies; and

WHEREAS, these requirements include a documented process for credentialing providers
that have signed contracts or participation agreements with Medicaid managed care entities;
and

WHEREAS, in Georgia, the lack of a standardized credentialing application for use in
credentialing providers creates increased paperwork and delay in the critical credentialing
process; and

WHEREAS, in Georgia, the credentialing application process often takes more than 120 daysand in some areas involves multiple applications; and

WHEREAS, because the credentialing process is a critical part of securing qualified
practitioners to render and manage care under care management organizations, it is crucial
to adopt and use effective policies; and

- 21 WHEREAS, a study is needed to establish a standardized credentialing application process
- 22 and to provide a reasonable application response time from the care management
- 23 organization and to provide for criteria for time extensions to such application response time.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that there is created the Senate Study Committee on Medicaid Care Management Organizations Credentialing to be composed of seven members to be appointed by the President of the Senate. The President of the Senate shall designate one of the appointees as chairperson. The committee shall meet at the call of the chairperson.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, 29 30 needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any actions 31 or legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate. The committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or 32 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and 33 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. All agencies of the state are 34 directed to provide the committee with such assistance as the committee shall require to 35 36 perform its assigned duties. In the event the committee makes a report of its findings and recommendations, with suggestions for proposed legislation, if any, such report shall be 37 made on or before December 1, 2014, at which time the committee shall stand abolished. 38
