A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging members of the United States Congress to enact federal legislation granting statehood
- 2 to the people of Washington, D.C.; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the people living on the land that would eventually be designated as the District
- 4 of Columbia were provided the right to vote for representation in Congress when the United
- 5 States Constitution was ratified in 1788; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the passage of the Organic Act of 1801 placed the District of Columbia under
- 7 the exclusive authority of the United States Congress and abolished the right of residents to
- 8 vote for members of Congress and the President and Vice President of the United States; and
- 9 WHEREAS, residents of the District of Columbia were granted the right to vote for the
- 10 president and vice president through passage of the Twenty-third Amendment to the United
- 11 States Constitution in 1961; and
- 12 WHEREAS, as of 2020, the United States Census Bureau data estimates that the District of
- 13 Columbia's population at approximately 712,000 residents is comparable to the populations

14 of Wyoming (582,000), Vermont (623,000), Alaska (731,000), and North Dakota (765,000);

- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, residents of the District of Columbia share all the responsibilities of United
- 17 States citizenship, including paying more federal taxes than residents of 22 states, service on
- 18 federal juries, and defending the United States as members of the United States armed forces
- 19 in every war since the War of Independence, yet they are denied full representation in
- 20 Congress; and
- 21 WHEREAS, the residents of the District of Columbia themselves have endorsed statehood
- 22 for the District of Columbia and passed a district-wide referendum on November 8, 2016,
- 23 which favored statehood by 86 percent; and
- 24 WHEREAS, no other democratic nation denies the right of self-government, including
- 25 participation in its national legislature, to the residents of its capital; and
- 26 WHEREAS, the residents of the District of Columbia lack full democracy, equality, and
- 27 citizenship enjoyed by the residents of the 50 states; and
- 28 WHEREAS, the United States Congress repeatedly has interfered with the District of
- 29 Columbia's limited self-government by enacting laws that affect the District of Columbia's
- 30 expenditure of its locally-raised tax revenue, including barring the usage of locally-raised
- 31 revenue, thus violating the fundamental principle that states and local governments are best
- 32 suited to enact legislation that represents the will of their citizens; and

33 WHEREAS, although the District of Columbia has passed consecutive balanced budgets

- 34 since Fiscal Year 1997, it still faces the possibility of being shut down yearly because of
- 35 Congressional deliberations over the federal budget; and
- 36 WHEREAS, District of Columbia Delegate Eleanor Holmes Norton and Delaware United
- 37 States Senator Tom Carper introduced in the 117th Congress H.R. 51 and S. 51, the
- 38 Washington, D.C., Admission Act, that provides that the State of Washington, D.C., would
- 39 have all the rights of citizenship as taxpaying American citizens, including two senators and
- 40 at least one House member; and
- 41 WHEREAS, the United Nations Human Rights Committee has called on the United States
- 42 Congress to address the District of Columbia's lack of political equality, and the Organization
- 43 of American States has declared the disenfranchisement of the District of Columbia residents
- 44 a violation of its charter agreement, to which the United States is a signatory.
- 45 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 46 support admitting Washington, D.C., into the Union as a state of the United States of
- 47 America.
- 48 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of this body urge the United States
- 49 Congress to enact federal legislation granting statehood to the people of Washington, D.C.
- 50 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 51 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the
- 52 press.
