A RESOLUTION

1 Commending Anastasia Davis upon being honored with the Girl Scout Bronze Award; and
2 for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, March 12, 2015, marks the 101st anniversary of Girl Scouts of the USA,
4 founded by Juliette Gordon Low in 1912 in Savannah, Georgia; and

5 WHEREAS, throughout its distinguished history, Girl Scouting has inspired millions of girls
6 and women with the highest ideals of courage, confidence, and character; and

7 WHEREAS, through the Girl Scout leadership experience, girls develop the skills and
8 lessons that will serve them throughout their lives, allowing them to contribute to their
9 communities; and

10 WHEREAS, Girl Scouting takes an active role in increasing girls' awareness of the
11 opportunities available to them in math, science, sports, technology, and other fields that can
12 expand their horizons; and

13 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts has shaped the lives of 53 percent of female senior executives and
14 business owners, 60 percent of women in Congress, and virtually every female astronaut; and

15 WHEREAS, the Bronze Award is the highest award in Junior Girl Scouting, and
16 requirements for this award include leadership activities, which Anastasia Davis performed
17 by collecting children's books and donating them to the special education classes in her
18 school; and

19 WHEREAS, Anastasia Davis, who is from the City of Dahlonega in Lumpkin County, has
20 received this prestigious award for her perseverance and continuous service to her
21 community and nation, and she represents the best this nation has to offer.

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
23 commend Anastasia Davis and congratulate her upon being honored with the Girl Scout
24 Bronze Award.
