- basketball, baseball, track, and football at Arlington High School, Damascus High School,

- 18 founding headmaster of Southwest Georgia Academy in Damascus in 1970; W.T. moved his

- 21 WHEREAS, W.T. was a former president of Georgia Independent Schools, and he also
