A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the success of lay person CPR training in increasing the survival rate of cardiac
- 2 arrest and supporting efforts to enhance public awareness of the need of such training; and
- 3 for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, two Gainesville students may not be here today if it were not for the lifesaving
- 5 measures of Dawn Wales and Gainesville City School staff who conducted immediate
- 6 bystander CPR and used in-school defibrillators to provide electrical shock to a stopped
- 7 heart; and
- 8 WHEREAS, heart disease affects men, women, and children of every age and race in the
- 9 United States, and sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) is a leading cause of death in the United
- 10 States, affecting approximately 356,000 people of all ages outside hospitals annually; and
- 11 WHEREAS, during this week alone, about 6,800 unsuspecting victims will suffer SCA, most
- 12 of them at home (about 70 percent); their hearts will unexpectedly stop beating, blood will
- 13 no longer flow to the brain and throughout the body, and they will collapse, stop breathing
- 14 normally, and may appear to be having seizures—in essence, they will be dead and they will
- 15 stay this way unless bystanders act immediately to restore their heartbeats with CPR and
- 16 defibrillation; and

17 WHEREAS, unfortunately, only 46 percent of SCA victims receive the help that they need

- 18 from bystanders before EMS arrives at the scene; and
- 19 WHEREAS, for every minute that passes without CPR and defibrillation, the chances of
- 20 survival decrease by 7-10 percent; as a result, only 10 percent of victims typically
- 21 survive—survival rates could double or triple if more people knew what to do when SCA
- 22 strikes; in fact, as many as 50,000 additional lives could be saved each year.
- 23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 24 pause in their deliberations to commend the great work by this team of lifesavers from
- 25 Gainesville City Schools in saving two students lives by initiating CPR.
- 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that today, February 23, 2023, is CPR-AED Awareness Day
- 27 at the Georgia state capitol.
- 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 29 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the
- 30 press.
