A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Congress of the United States to eliminate all requirements for the use of ethanol
- 2 as a fuel for vehicles and equipment; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, ethanol, or ethyl alcohol, increases water formation, resulting in the corrosion
- 4 of metals, plastics, and rubber, especially over time when an engine is not used.
- 5 High-performance specialty parts, along with older cars and parts, may be most susceptible
- 6 to such corrosion; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the life span of vehicles and equipment can be reduced with use of the wrong
- 8 fuel and due to the corrosion of integral vehicle and equipment parts, operators could be
- 9 confronted with breakdowns. Anti-corrosive additives are expensive, burdensome, and
- 10 require consumer education; and
- 11 WHEREAS, there is limited access to unblended gasoline for engines that may be damaged
- by ethanol, including collector vehicles, off-road vehicles, motorcycles, or small engines; and
- 13 WHEREAS, many underground storage tanks and fuel lines are made of steel or other
- 14 materials that may be degraded or corroded by ethanol, increasing potential for leaks that
- 15 endanger groundwater supplies.
- 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 GEORGIA that the members of this body urge the Congress of the United States to eliminate
- all requirements for the use of ethanol as a fuel for vehicles and equipment.
- 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 20 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to each member of the
- 21 Georgia congressional delegation.
