A RESOLUTION

1 Commending the 4-H Clubs of Georgia; recognizing February 23, 2015, as 4-H Day at the
2 capitol; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, 4-H members consistently demonstrate the ability and leadership necessary to
4 be champions and serve as outstanding representatives and officers of the young people of
5 Georgia; and

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Ben Hancock of Irwin County serves with distinction and dedication as
7 State 4-H President; and

8 WHEREAS, Mr. Arch D. Smith of the University of Georgia Cooperative Extension and
9 State 4-H Leader has worked diligently with the 4-H Clubs throughout Georgia; and

10 WHEREAS, the leadership, dedication, and hard work of Dalton Bowie of Butts County,
11 Devin Thornton of DeKalb County, Tyler Wagner of Jenkins County, and Ben Lord of Ben
12 Hill County as District Presidents have been acknowledged by the 4-H membership in their
13 election of each of these young people to serve as president for 2014-2015; and

14 WHEREAS, the excellent record of accomplishments in citizenship and leadership of
15 Jasmine Render of Clayton County, Hannah Rull of Paulding County, Bailey Dickinson of
16 Stephens County, and Jacob Rowland of Toombs County were recognized in Washington,
17 D.C., at the 2014 National 4-H Conference; and

18 WHEREAS, Kirsten Morris of Chatham County and Janna Brown of Pulaski County were
19 named 2014 Leadership in Action Winners; and

20 WHEREAS, Morgan Anne Pippin of Evans County, Drew Bellflower of Bleckley County,
21 Thomas Gilbert of Bartow County, Brooks Saye of Oconee County, and Sunnie Dee Wynn
22 of Thomas County were named state winners in the 2014 Dean's Awards competition; and

23 WHEREAS, Hannah Mosely of Bleckley County was declared champion of the 2014
24 National 4-H Egg Preparation Demonstration Contest at the National 4-H Poultry and Egg
25 Conference in Louisville, Kentucky; and

26 WHEREAS, Sam Payne of Bartow County won first place at the National 4-H Shooting
27 Sports Invitational in Grand Island, Nebraska.
