A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the 79th anniversary of the United Negro College Fund; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the United Negro College Fund (UNCF) was founded with 27 member colleges
- 3 in April, 1944, under the leadership of Dr. Frederick D. Patterson, Mary McLeod Bethune,
- 4 William J. Trent, and others; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the UNCF is the nation's largest, oldest, most successful, and comprehensive
- 6 higher education assistance organization for minorities; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the mission of UNCF is to enhance the quality of education by providing
- 8 financial assistance to deserving students, raising operating funds for member colleges and
- 9 universities, and increasing access to technology for students and faculty at historically Black
- 10 colleges and universities; and
- WHEREAS, as the nation's largest private scholarship provider to students of color, UNCF
- awards more than \$100 million in scholarships to more than 10,000 students at more than
- 13 1,100 schools each year across the country, including its prestigious network of 37 HBCUs;

WHEREAS, in 79 years, the UNCF has raised \$4.8 billion to help more than 500,000

- students earn their college degrees and managed numerous scholarship programs, including
- 17 the Fund II Foundation UNCF STEM Scholars Program, the UNCF/Koch Scholars Program,
- 18 the K-12 Education Fellowship, and the Frederick Douglass Bicentennial Scholarship
- 19 Program; and
- 20 WHEREAS, the UNCF provides key support to historically Black colleges and universities
- as a means to keep tuition lower than comparable schools while its member institutions
- 22 provide a quality education to students, many of whom are the first in their families to attend
- 23 college; and
- 24 WHEREAS, the UNCF's 37 member colleges and universities have contributed
- 25 immeasurably to communities throughout the nation and around the world with countless
- 26 graduates who are the top producers in medicine, education, religion, business, law, politics,
- and community leadership.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 29 recognize the United Negro College Fund on the occasion of its 79th anniversary and for its
- 30 outstanding commitment to providing a quality education for minority and low-income
- 31 students and promoting leaders to strengthening our global community.
- 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 33 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the
- 34 press.
