A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing and commending former First Lady Rosalynn Carter for her commitment to
- 2 mental health; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, former First Lady Rosalynn Carter has been actively working in dedicated
- 4 service to the State of Georgia, the United States, and the world as she has served as the
- 5 nation's foremost champion for the rights of people with mental illnesses; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter is united in love and marriage to former President Jimmy Carter,
- 7 and the two have been blessed with four remarkable children, John, James, Donnel, and
- 8 Amy; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter served as the First Lady of Georgia from 1971 to 1975 and First
- 10 Lady of the United States from 1977 to 1981; and
- 11 WHEREAS, during President Carter's term in the White House, Mrs. Carter assumed the role
- of Active Honorary Chair of the President's Commission on Mental Health, which began on
- 13 February 17, 1977, and eventually created and submitted the Mental Health Systems Act, the
- most sweeping reform on mental health legislation in 30 years, which was passed and funded
- in September, 1980; and
- 16 WHEREAS, even after her husband's presidency, she has continued to diligently and
- 17 conscientiously devote her time, talents, and energy toward the betterment of people in our
- 18 state, our country, and world as evidenced by her years of exceptional service with The
- 19 Carter Center, a private, nonprofit institution founded by former President and Mrs. Jimmy
- 20 Carter in 1982, where she served as vice chair of the board of trustees until May 2005; and
- 21 WHEREAS, she has served as a volunteer at the Georgia Regional Hospital in Atlanta and
- 22 for four years was honorary chairperson for the Georgia Special Olympics; and

WHEREAS, she continues her efforts to improve mental health care and to promote other

- 24 projects that would result in "good for others" such as Habitat for Humanity, a nonprofit
- 25 organization that helps people build their own homes; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter also has written several books, two of which were about mental
- 27 illness: Helping Someone with Mental Illness and Within Our Reach: Ending the Mental
- 28 Health Crisis; and
- 29 WHEREAS, she is a woman with an unimpeachable reputation for integrity, intelligence,
- 30 fairness, and kindness, and it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding
- 31 accomplishments of this distinguished Georgian be appropriately recognized.
- 32 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 33 commend former First Lady Rosalynn Carter for decades of efficient, effective, and
- 34 dedicated public service to the State of Georgia, congratulate her upon the grand occasion
- 35 of her presentation on mental health at The Carter Center, and extend their sincere best
- 36 wishes for continued success on her mission to improve the quality and quantity of services
- 37 available for those in need of mental health services.

- 39 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to former First Lady Rosalynn Carter.
